Re: Justices of the Peace

Dear Mayor and Council Members:

As a result of a successful court challenge to the way state law required justices of the peace to be selected, and the subsequent amendment of state law in response, our local ordinance on the subject needs review and possible revision. Currently, Section 2-35 of the Danbury Code of Ordinances provides for the selection of 30 justices. Under prior law those justices were nominated exclusively by the two major parties (as determined by party enrollment). Under the amended state law, no more than 2/3 of that total may come from major parties.

As a result, in order to maintain the same level of participation by Republicans and Democrats while affording an opportunity for unaffiliated voters to participate, the number of justices of the peace selected in Danbury must be increased from 30 to 45. I have prepared an amendment to the Code of Ordinances to accomplish this if it is your desire to do so. Please find the proposal enclosed.

THAT section 2-35 of the Code of Ordinances of Danbury, Connecticut is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-35. Justices of the peace.

The number of justices of the peace for the City of Danbury shall be thirty (30). THE NUMBER OF JUSTICES OF THE PEACE TO BE SELECTED IN THE CITY OF DANBURY IN 1996 AND QUADRENNIALLY THEREAFTER SHALL BE FORTY-FIVE (45). SAID JUSTICES OF THE PEACE SHALL BE SELECTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CONNECTICUT GENERAL STATUTES.

Deletions are indicated by ~~strikeouts~~.

New language is indicated by CAPITALIZATION COMBINED WITH UNDERSCORING.

The attached Agreement represents a supplement to an original Agreement and First Supplemental Agreement approved by you earlier (in 1993 and 1995 respectively). The agreement provides for a small upward adjustment in the amount to be reimbursed to Danbury through federal and State matching funds. The adjustment will increase said amount from \$356,000.00 to \$377,125.00. According to the Cost Estimate provided by the State, the municipal share (12.5%) of the cost will also be slightly adjusted due to this increase in the reimbursement schedule.




Figure 2 : " Lake-wide "treatment of Kenosia with collaborative funding by City of Danbury and Lake Place

Condominium Association




Figure 1 : "Spot Treatment Area" of Lake Kenosia

As a follow up to the meeting we held with Mayor Eriquez and yourself, the Lake Place Condominium Association formalizes its proposal to the City for a lake-wide herbicide application to Lake Kenosia to control the growth of aquatic weeds. The Association has raised funding to conduct a limited herbicide application near the Lake Place beach and the outlet of the Lake (see figure 1, attached). However, based on the recommendation of a study of the Lake which we conducted last year, effective control of the *Eurasian Watermilfoil* and other nuisance weeds should encompass a broader area along the north shore of the Lake up to Kenosia Park beach (see figure 2).

Therefore, we propose to share the cost of weed control on this broader area with the City so that a lake wide treatment of the weeds can occur. If we apply the herbicide (Sonar) prior to Memorial Day, the weed treatment will be effective in controlling growth this summer and should last through 1997. The estimated cost of treating the area shown on figure 2 is \$9,000.00. The Lake Place Condominium Association is willing to donate \$4,500.00 for this service if the City can appropriate the balance.

Please let me know if you have any questions regarding this proposal. We look forward to working with the City on this endeavor.


This letter is a formal request for action to be taken for the sequential numbering of all the buildings on Old Ridgebury Rd. This request has previously been made by residents but to date no action has been taken. Some residents have taken it upon themselves to assign a number to their individual house and/or building, however, the numbers neither are in sequence nor have any pattern. Although we have been living on Old Ridgebury Rd for the past 30 years, there has never been a formal attempt to address this need. The Buildings Permit Office directed us to put our request in writing to the Danbury Common Council.

This past weekend while we were out of town our home was burglarized. Our neighbor, noticing that the lights were on, called the police. The police in their attempt to respond to the 911 call were unable to locate our home. After passing our house several times they sought directions from our neighbor on Flirtation Turn. Our home is situated on a open corner lot and if numbered would be easily located. The first statement the police said to our neighbor was, "This street is ridiculous . The numbers on the homes or mailboxes are not in any sequence and some are not numbered at all." When the police arrived in our neighborhood, they had come directly from Aunt Hack where they were investigating a robbery that had just occurred. Upon entering our house the police found fresh snow footprints still on our carpeting. The police felt that if they had been able to come directly to our house they might very well have been able to abort the robbery while it was still in progress. Instead, they were side-tracked by the lack of a numbering system on Old Ridgebury, and as a result we suffered a much greater loss.


This is only one incident, however, it is not the only time when police and/or ambulances have been hampered by the lack of a numbering system. We have enclosed a rough drawing of the numbers on Old Ridgebury Rd. which we hope will illustrate the present problem. We do not feel that our simply choosing an arbitrary number for our house will be an adequate solution. For the future safety of the neighborhood and to ensure that police, ambulance, fire, and postal services can properly serve us, we are requesting the necessary procedures be taken to improve the numbering system and put our minds at ease. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.



**Proposed Sanitary Sewer Extension
Birchcrest Drive, Cedar Crest Drive,
Lindencrest Drive, Driftway Point Road**

At the March 5, 1996 Common Council meeting, the request for sanitary sewer extensions in the above noted streets was referred to our office for a survey.

Our office and the Public Utilities Department have reviewed this request. We cannot support this petition for a sanitary sewer extension for the following reasons:


1. The area in question does not fall within the future sanitary sewer service area as designated in the City's "Comprehensive Sewerage Study" dated December 1987.
2. A portion of the area in question lies within a Class I Watershed Area and the remainder of the area lies within a Class II Watershed Area both as defined in the Danbury Zoning Regulations. These regulations discourage the installation of sanitary sewers in Class I and Class II Watershed Areas.
3. To service the majority of those properties represented by the petition, a pumping station in the vicinity of Driftway Point Road would be required (the elevation difference between Driftway Point Road and the intersection of Cedar Crest Drive and Birchcrest Drive is approximately 24.5 feet). Said pumping station would be located on the watershed of West Lake Reservoir and most likely only a thousand feet more or less from the shore of the reservoir.

In our opinion the City's best interests would not be served by this sewer extension.

If you have any questions or would like to discuss this matter, please feel free to contact us. We look forward to further direction from the Common Council.

Today it stands in the way of progress. As Miry Brook district expands commercially it becomes less desirable as a place anyone would want to live, at least the area my property is located.


In view of this, I would like to meet with you to discuss a proposition that would benefit both the City and myself.


There is no City owned land on Middle River Road which is available for development. All City owned land along Middle River Road is a part of or serves to protect West Lake Reservoir.







Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Danbury:

THAT Chapter 12 of the Code of Ordinances of Danbury, Connecticut is hereby amended by the addition of a new section which said section shall be numbered 12-4 and shall read as follows:

Sec. 12-4. Removal of animal-litter.

It shall be unlawful for any person owning, keeping, walking, or in control of, any dog or other animal to allow or permit such animal to defecate upon any property of the City of Danbury, including, but not limited to, public streets or roads, sidewalks, parks, and school grounds, unless such person shall remove all feces so deposited by such animal before leaving the immediate premises. The provisions of this section shall not apply to a guide dog accompanying any blind person. Each violation of this section shall be punishable by a fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00) or such maximum fine as may be permitted by law.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after adoption and publication as provided by law and section 3-10 of the Charter of the City of Danbury.



There is an existing private water system which is in a state of great disrepair. The State of Connecticut Department of Public Utilities Control and the Department of Health have recommended that the City of Danbury take over this system in order to provide potable water at a reasonable cost.

There were a number of people who spoke at the preceding public hearing. Most of those speaking were in favor of the project. A number of speakers were concerned with their inclusion in the project, though they were not petitioners. They are, however, assessed because they are along the route of the water line.

The City of Danbury has negotiated to install this water extension for \$1,200,000. This amount will be paid by those benefiting from the installation.

After considerable discussion Mrs. Butera moved to recommend approval of the project, adoption of the resolution and the authorization for the Mayor to enter into two agreements with the Pleasant Acres Homeowners Association. The first is an agreement for the maintenance of the water system during the construction period and the second is for the sale of the system. The motion was seconded by Mr. Scalzo. Request for a Waiver of Bid

The committee appointed to review the request for a waiver of bid for the Margerie and West Lake Treatment Plant Project met at 6:30pm on March 19, 1996 and at 6:00pm on March 25, 1996 in City Hall. Councilmembers Arconti, Setaro and Carboni attended both meetings along with City Engineer Jack Schweitzer and Superintendent of Public Utilities Bill Buckley. Mario Ricoszi of the Water Dept., Warren Platz, the Director of Purchasing, and Assistant Corporation Counsel Les Pinter attended the March 19 meeting; and Assistant Corporation Counsel Eric Gottschalk attended the meeting on March 25th.

Mr. Buckley explained the purpose of this request to the committee. Basically, it would expand the role of Metcalf & Eddy, the City's design engineer for this project, to include the management and oversight of the construction phase. (As the design engineer, Metcalf & Eddy will be responsible for project oversight regardless of how the City chooses to proceed with this project). The proposed method would transfer some of the procedures, normally conducted by the City, to Metcalf & Eddy. In effect, we would be selecting them to act as the construction manager on behalf of the City. It is this selection to this position that requires the Common Council to approve a waiver of bid. If this should occur, Metcalf & Eddy would then solicit and receive bids from contractors to perform the work. This approach is similar to the design/build method commonly used in the private sector and offers potential benefits to the City, as follows:

1. Metcalf & Eddy can pre-qualify bidders to determine the capabilities and soundness of companies wishing to participate in this project. This should result in a better managed and more smoothly run project, which could result in a 5 to 7 percent savings in overall project costs.
2. Metcalf & Eddy will incorporate a project labor agreement into their subsequent contracts which will establish priority consideration for the hiring of local labor. While such an agreement cannot guarantee specific levels of local employment, it would require the contractors to seek and hire qualified tradespeople from the local labor pool, prior to bringing in workers from outside the Danbury area.


The Common Council Committee appointed to review the request for a traffic control signal at Route 6 and Aunt Hack Road met on March 25, 1996 at 10:00 P.M. in the Fourth Floor Lobby in City Hall. In attendance were committee members Scalzo, Gomez and Carboni. Also in attendance were City Engineer Jack Schweitzer and Council Member Pauline Basso, ex-officio.

Mr. Scalzo review the letter from Police Chief Macedo and the supporting letter from the State Department of Transportation recommending the installation of a traffic control at the above location. The cost of the installation is estimated to be \$56,000 which includes providing fire pre-emption of the signal. The cost to the City should be approximately \$6,200.00. Mr. Gomez asked about the synchronization with the other traffic lights on Route 6 and the time frame for installation and operation. Mr. Schweitzer explained that synchronization would occur when Route 6 (Mill Plain Road) improvements were constructed. He also stated that it would take about one year to complete the project should the Common Council approve it.

Mrs. Carboni and Mrs. Basso had concerns about the need and cost of traffic signals and pointed out that there were so few accidents at the location. It was noted by Mr. Schweitzer that the number of accidents is not the only criteria used for the installation of a traffic light and that egress from Joe's Hill Road and Aunt Hack Road was an important factor and the traffic light would have a trip signal. It was also noted that funding from the State may or may not be available in 5 to 7 years when improvements to Route 6 are scheduled.

Mr. Gomez made a motion to recommend approval of the traffic control signal along with the appropriation of the necessary funding and that the Mayor proceed with the execution of a cost sharing agreement with the State DOT. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Carboni and passed unanimously.







The subcommittee to review the road acceptance of Indian Avenue met at 9:15 PM in the Lobby of Danbury City Hall on March 25, 1996. In attendance were Council Members Eileen Coladarci, Roberto Gomez and Pauline Basso. Also in attendance were Mr. Jack Schweitzer, Director of Public Works, Mr. Eric Gottschalk, Corporation Council and four interested members of Indian Avenue; Ms. Vita Ferez, Mr. William Musinski, Mr. Dana Eilertson and Mr. Ken Biechy, the petitioner.

Ms. Coladarci asked Mr. Gottschalk to explain the two ordinances that may affect Indian Avenue. City Ordinance 2-143 is a public improvement process in which the residents of the road are assessed for a benefit of improvement based on a four part formula. The formula include a 1/4th assessment on assessed value, 1/4th on frontage, 1/4th on area and 1/4th on the number of units. To use this ordinance the residents will be surveyed in regard to the preliminary numbers as determined by the Engineering Department. The residents will also be asked to speak for or against the numbers at a public hearing.


Ms. Coladarci then asked Mr. Gottchalk to discuss City Ordinance 17-34. Mr. Gottchalk then explained that for either choice, the Engineering Department will have to provide the City and the residents a preliminary assessment of the extent of repairs needed and approximate cost.


Mr. Schweitzer explained that the Engineering Department can provide the residents with the assessed value of the improvements needed to bring Indian Avenue up to City Code.


