


Dear Ms. Crudginton:

On March 31, 1983, I ate lunch near the duck pond in Roger's Park. When I departed, I stopped to discard my rubbish in one of the rubbish receptacles, the one near the brook, small bridge and the drainage culvert. Unfortunately, I came too close to the culvert, and the combination of the stone, along with concrete slashed my right front tire. I inspected the culvert, and I feel that it is in need of major repair. I feel that this condition is the responsibility of the City of Danbury, and that I should be reimbursed for the replacement of that tire. The tires which I have on the vehicle have approximately 27,000 miles with an expected life of 40,000 to 50,000 miles.

To Whom It May Concern:

This is a request for favorable consideration for reimbursement of expenses incurred as a result of damage to my 1982 Pontiac Bonneville automobile.

The facts justifying such reimbursement can be summarized as follows:

(1) On the night of March 8, 1983 at approximately 6:45 P. M., I was driving my 1982 Pontiac Bonneville automobile along East Pembroke Road, a Danbury city road, in route to a Boy Scout Court of Honor meeting for my son which was scheduled to begin at 7:30 P. M. at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in Newtown, Connecticut;

(2) The left front tire and the left rear tire of my automobile impacted with a very deep pothole on East Pembroke Road, flattening the left rear tire and knocking the front end out of alignment;

(3) My wife, son and two daughters were occupants in the automobile at the time of the impact with the pothole;

(4) The weather conditions were rainy on the night of March 8, 1983 as had been the previous two days;

(5) In approximately the 30 minute period required to

change the automobile tire, a station wagon apparently impacted with the same pothole sustaining a flattened tire and a Volkswagon also apparently impacted with the same pothole displacing and scattering certain internal parts of the Volkswagon along portions of East Pembroke Road;

(6) On the morning of March 9, 1983 at approximately 8:15 A. M., I reported the existence of the pothole to the highway department of the City of Danbury wherein they indicated that a person would be sent to examine and repair the pothole that same morning; they also indicated that East Pembroke Road was a city road; and

(7) Also on the morning of March 9, 1983 at approximately 9:15 A. M., I reported the damage to the Office of the City Clerk of Danbury and was informed to submit this letter as the initial step in seeking reimbursement of expenses incurred as a result of damage to my automobile.

Attached and submitted herewith are photocopies of bills incurred for necessary repairs to my automobile which can be summarized as follows:


(1) Replacement of one Uniroyal 195-SR14 tire including mounting, balancing and labor..... \$81.24.

(2) Front end realignment.....\$30.00.

The Uniroyal 195-SR14 tire had to be special ordered and was not installed on my automobile until March 28, 1983. The total extent of expenses incurred for repairs as evidenced by the attached photocopies of bills amounts to \$111.24.

It is respectfully requested that the total expenses for repairs amounting to \$111.24 as evidenced by the attached photocopies be reimbursed in full to the undersigned. Early and favorable action on this claim is courteously solicited.

INCIDENT DETAILS

While on patrol upon the above date and time, this officer was sent to see Judy Caprio at Overlook Dr. Upon arrival, she stated that approximately 1200 hrs. or shortly thereafter, after she was proceeding northbound on Great Plain Rd., approx. 100-150 feet north of Tamarac Tr. her vehicle exhibited a tire, which she stated she could not have avoided blowing out. She stated she checked the tire and it was not indicated that it was flat. She stated she was driving on the left side of the road when she noticed the tire. She stated that the tire which appeared to be flat was new. The tire had a Tear and the tire itself was not indicated that it had just come off the vehicle. The photos in question in their northbound travel showed a tread pattern. One foot by four foot by approx. four inches deep. This had struck the same vehicle and notified 11911 at the scene. 



CITY OF DANBURY, STATE OF CONNECTICUT

RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Danbury:

WHEREAS, the Connecticut Department of Health Services has made available funds for the purpose of providing a Refugee Health Service in accordance with Section 4-8 and Section 19-10 of the Connecticut General Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the City of Danbury through the Danbury Health Department in cooperation with the Visiting Nurse Association of Danbury has formulated a program to provide a refugee health assessment program within the Greater Danbury area; and

WHEREAS, a contract of \$4,000 with no local match requirement may be available from the Connecticut Department of Health Services.





Dear Mayor and Madam President:

In reference to the above captioned matter, our office represents the Housing Authority of the City of Danbury. Down through the years, at varying times, abandoned and/or unregistered motor vehicles have been left on property of the Housing Authority of the City of Danbury. In the past, the problem has been remedied by the Housing Authority notifying the Danbury Police Department and having the abandoned or unregistered motor vehicle towed away. After storing for a minimum of thirty (30) days and a maximum of ninety (90) days, the owner of the towing and storage firm may sell the motor vehicle at public auction after duly advertising the sale. See §§14-145 and 14-150 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

Unfortunately, private wrecking and towing firms in Danbury do not want to become involved with towing and storing vehicles from property of the Housing Authority of the City of Danbury. Their reasons are based on the fact that the motor vehicles are usually not worth one hundred (\$100.00) dollars and this means that by storing the vehicle and by advertising

the sale, these private towing and wrecking concerns will lose money.

The Housing Authority, at this point, has no means of securing the disposal of these abandoned and/or unregistered motor vehicles. We point out for the record that these vehicles, with windows smashed, tires removed, trunks broken into, etc., present safety hazards to children living in the various projects where motor vehicles are abandoned from time to time.

The Executive Director of the Housing Authority, Mr. James McKenney, has had recent conversations with Mr. Robert M. Steinberg. Mr. McKenney asked our office to get involved. Our office has had conversations with the fulltime Assistant Corporation Counsel, Eric L. Gottschalk, Esq., and with Mr. Steinberg. We have tentatively agreed that §14-150a of the Connecticut General Statutes may provide an answer to our problem.

The statute provides, and we have enclosed a copy for your review, that the legislative body of any municipality may provide for the removal of abandoned, inoperable or unregistered motor vehicles which remain unmoved for thirty (30) days after certain specific acts.

First, the owner of the property must be notified of the abandoned vehicle and at the same time requested to remove the said vehicle. Second, notice of the proposed action, i.e. towing and sale, must be published in a newspaper having a substantial circulation in such municipality. We would presume that a description of the motor vehicle with a description of its location must be included in the above notice.

Finally the statute, §14-150a, mandates that the local legislative body shall designate the local agency or officer who shall be responsible for carrying out the removal and disposition of the vehicle.

Mr. Steinberg, Mr. McKenney, Attorney Gottschalk and myself believe that the procedure outlined above will be inexpensive to initiate and once started it would pay for itself. First, the initial cost would be the first few advertisements in the News Times. The former "bugaboo" of storage fees would be avoided because the vehicle would remain on the HACD's property for thirty (30) days after the legal notice. Second, the vehicle can


be towed and sold the same day. The tow truck operator will realize his fee immediately. Perhaps, the city could solicit bids from scrap metal dealers and have them tow at their own cost. This procedure is not prohibited by the statute.

This problem also plagues other property owners and could be implemented to help them.

It is our request, therefore, that the City of Danbury's Common Council enact the necessary ordinance to implement the provisions of §14-150a of the State Statutes. If we can be of any assistance, we would be more than happy to assist Attorney Gottschalk in any way we could.


We have been selected by the City of Danbury to purchase and renovate the Ives Street firehouse. Our plans call for the building and the site to be entirely restored according to criteria established by the National Trust for Historic Preservation, to qualify for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. We expect to lease the entire building to an experienced restaurant operator who will install a two hundred seat restaurant on the premises, employing approximately seventy-five full and part-time workers.

It is our understanding that the City of Danbury and the Redevelopment Agency have plans for extensive public and private improvements in the general area of Ives Street over the next several years, aimed at retaining a vital downtown business district. We believe that preserving the historic character of the area will promote revitalization.

In keeping with our commitment to preserve the exterior of the firehouse in its original form, we think it would be desirable to maintain the alley that presently connects National Place and Ives Street as a public pedestrian passage. As I have discussed with you previously, the City Welfare Department is responsible for the medical costs of Danbury's indigent. This letter and subsequent request is dealing with inpatient costs incurred at the Danbury Hospital.

This Department has begun to address this issue. For the past week Patricia Krafick, the assistant welfare supervisor, and I have been meeting with Credit Department at the Hospital.

The first two days of working with hospital staff resulted in the City accepting responsibility for twenty-two inpatient bills amounting to \$66,860.04 owed for seventeen people. This number is a fraction of the bills and applications demanding attention. The estimated total is a figure unavailable at this time. As the work progresses the total will become more overwhelming.

It is my request that the Council allocate the above \$66,860.04 at this time so that the initial bills can be paid.

This request will be referred to committee as is customary. I recommend that the committee invite me and Patricia Krafick, Donald Sutherland, Credit Collection Supervisor, Danbury Hospital, and Frederick Hansen, General Assistance Consultant of the State Department of Income Maintenance.

The concerns of all parties involved will be best understood with this group meeting together.

I would also request that the Council form a standing committee to deal with the issue of the health care needs of Danbury's poorer population.

"Wherever in this Code or in any ordinance of the City an act is prohibited or made or declared to be unlawful or an offense or violation, or wherever in such Code or ordinance the duty of an act is required or the failure to do an act is declared to be unlawful, and no specific penalty is provided therefor, the violation of any such provision of this Code or any such ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred (\$100) dollars. Each day's violation of any provision of this Code or of any ordinance shall constitute a separate offence."

"The Mayor, or in his absence, the president of the Common Council, or in the absence of both, the majority leader shall preside, and on the appearance of a quorum, shall call the members to order, and cause the records of the previous meeting to be read so that any mistakes in the record may be corrected. The reading of said record may be dispensed with on a vote to suspend the rule, provided the Mayor has approved and signed the same."



ORDINANCE

COMMON COUNCIL

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Danbury:

THAT Section 2-83 of the Code of Ordinances of Danbury, Connecticut be and hereby is amended to read as follows:

"The presiding officer shall preserve order and decorum, may speak to questions of order in preference to other members, and shall decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Common Council, by motion regularly seconded. No other business shall be in order until the question on the appeal shall have been decided."

THAT Section 2-86 of the Code of Ordinances of Danbury, Connecticut be and hereby is amended to read as follows:

"The previous question shall be in this form: 'Shall the main question be now put?' It shall only be admitted when demanded by a majority of the members present, and until decided it shall preclude all amendments and debate of the main question. After adoption of the previous question, the sense of the Common Council shall forthwith be taken upon all pending amendments in their order, and then upon the main question.


"The yeas and nays shall be taken when called for by one of the members present."


"No member shall speak more than once on a question until each member choosing to speak shall have spoken, nor shall any member more than twice on the same question speak without leave of the membership. When two or more members rise at the same time, the presiding officer shall name the member who shall speak first."

"No member who is speaking shall be interrupted by another, except by a call to order or to correct a mistake. If any member, in speaking or otherwise, transgresses the rules of the Common Council, the presiding officer shall, and any member may, call him to order, in which case the member so called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain. Where there is an appeal and a decision in favor of the member called to order, he shall be at liberty to proceed, but not otherwise."

"All reports of committees or City officers shall be in writing and accompanied by such order, resolution or bill as the reporting committee or officer shall recommend for the action of the Common Council. Orders, resolutions or bills reported by any committee or officer may be recommitted, together with the report, at any time before their passage or rejection."



 - (1) Streets and highways
 - (2) Buildings and encroachments
 - (3) Sewers
 - (4) Waterworks
 - (5) Fire Department
 - (6) Police Department
 - (7) Street lights
 - (8) Health
 - (9) Nuisances
 - (10) Licenses
 - (11) Parks, tanks and fountains
 - (12) Sidewalks
 - (13) Paving and gutters
 - (14) Special committees
 - (15) Public Works
 - (16) Corporation Counsel
 - (17) Miscellaneous reports
- (g) Seventh, unfinished business, reports and ordinances.

"This order of proceeding shall be adhered to as a rule, except in the case of special assignments, which shall be heard at the time assigned."

No item offered by any individual member of the Common Council shall be placed on the consent calendar unless it has been delivered to the Clerk of the Common Council who shall refer a copy thereof to the majority leader, the minority leader or their designees, for possible inclusion on the consent calendar."



The board of awards established pursuant to Chapter 6 of the Danbury Municipal Charter shall by majority vote, make all decisions regarding the selection of independent contractors hereunder."





(1) Demolition permits	Three (3%) percent of the actual cost of demolition
(2) Permits for the moving of buildings	\$20.00 per building
(3) Permits for vented-type gas-fired heaters	\$5.00 each
(4) Permits for oil burners	\$5.00 each
(5) Permits for wood stoves	\$5.00 each
(6) Permits for tanks with a capacity in excess of 500 gal.	\$5.00 each
(7) Permits for signs	(a) If ten square feet, or less, \$10.00 (b) If in excess of ten square feet, \$10.00 for the first ten square feet and fifty cents per square foot for each additional square foot or part thereof.

"(c) As used in subsections (a) and (b) hereof, the phrases "value of work" and "actual cost of demolition" shall mean and include the entire cost of construction, alteration, repair or demolition and shall include the value of all materials and labor used.

"(d) Demolition performed by, or on behalf of, any state, federal, or municipal government shall be exempt from the permit fee requirements of this section."



The Common Council Liaison Budget Committee consisting of Council members Torian, Evans, Farah, Torcaso, Eriquez, McManus, Foti, Elder and Leopold, met on the following dates to review the budget proposal of the Board of Education for the fiscal year of 1983-1984.

The committee voted to recommend to the full Common Council a 9.5% increase in funding to the Board of Education for the fiscal year 1983-1984, totalling \$2,568,343 for a total budget of \$29,603,538. This represents approximately 92.484% of the total amount of \$32,009,295 requested by the Board.

The committee takes note of the Board's concern that shortages exist in efforts to eliminate split classes, textbooks, supplies and equipment, funding of inter scholastic and intramural sports program, including an Athletic Director.

The committee's analysis of the budget revealed that several areas of the budget showed evidence of substantial over-funding, and our suggestion to the Board would be to consider the re-allocation of funding in these areas to cover the above shortages.

Specific instances of over-funding appeared in the following areas: non-teaching salary accounts, employee benefits, public utilities, gasoline, fuel oil accounts and the absence of a 3-year bid solicitation on garbage refuse removal.

The committee recognizes that the Common Council has only bottom-line authority in this budgetary process and it is the exclusive authority of the Board to make line item funding decisions.

We would hope however, that some consideration would be given to our suggestive comments.

The City of Danbury has always championed education and considers it key to its goals of long-range development and sustained growth as evidenced by the attached statement which depicts in part, the City's priority to education in its total City Budget funding over the past several years.
