
Robert Fuda presented to our office on January 31, 1980, with a fracture of the incisal edge of the upper left central due to a wrestling accident. The tooth was restored with an acid etch composite material.

In the future it is possible that the tooth may need root canal treatment, a gold post, and a crown. The upper right central and lower left lateral incisor were also affected by the accident and they too may require root canal treatment, gold posts and crowns in the future. 

This is a second petition to correct the hazardous drainage that remains between 32 and 34 Kingswood Road.

Our original petition of March 1978 which is attached, requested improved drainage between 32 and 34 as well as 33 and 35 Kingswood Road. This project was approved by the council for completion in the summer of 1978. The highway department installed an extension between 33 and 35 Kingswood in the hope that "It may not be necessary" to install an extension between 32 and 34 Kingswood. In the winter months that followed the problem persisted and it was promised by the Superintendent of Public Works to complete the original requests. Since I understand he has left his position I am asking for your assistance in seeing that this project is completed during the summer of 1980.

I trust that my persistence over these years is a clear indication of the dangers which exist. If you see as I do the cars racing to make it to the top of the hill only to find iced roads and children waiting for a school bus then you'd share my sense of urgency to complete this project.

I, Douglas Curry, resident at 34 Kingswood Road, Danbury Connecticut, and the below-listed signers are hereby petitioning for two extensions to the storm drains situated between 32 and 34 Kingswood Road and 33 and 35 Kingswood Road for the following reasons:

During the winter months, poor drainage at this location causes exceptionally heavy ice buildup. Repeated freezing and thawing helps to create long, deep ruts in the roadway ice, which remain until the spring thaw. Each season, this results in serious deterioration of the main road, requiring resurfacing.

Last winter, cars, schoolbuses, and other service vehicles were frequently stranded in these ruts. The resulting congestion represented not only an inconvenience for residents, drivers, and children waiting to go to school, but also a serious traffic hazard.

The contours of the road place this area at the top of two very steep grades and at the bottom of another steep grade. Curves in the road combine to make it a poor visibility area under the best weather conditions. Ice on the road and vehicles stranded in the ruts described make this area extremely dangerous.

I reside at 74 Hillendale Road (lower section) in Danbury. A brook or stream on my property carries run off water from Hillendale Road (and Clapboard Bridge Road). This runoff has continually eroded my property. This process had become particularly acute upon the town's installation in 1978 of a cement conduit from the road on an angle towards the brook's bank.

After the winter of 1978, I spoke with the City Engineer. In essence, he informed me that:

A. He would work to solve my erosion problem)

6
B. Currently his manpower was tied upon previous commitments

C. As a temporary mechanism, his men would install two cement blocks along the bank to take the impact of the water from the conduit.

This past winter was a disaster. I lost at least 8' x 4' worth of property on one bank and an immeasurable amount on the opposite bank. Several small evergreen trees are about to be undermined. In addition, the cement blocks are an eyesore to the property.

I respectfully request that this matter be put on the agenda of the Darby Common Council as soon as possible. Would you please notify me as to this action and any other steps I might take to rectify this problem.

This office represents Rea Lubar, Inc. which owns premises in the City of Danbury which are encumbered in part by an easement dedicated by virtue of filing a map on the Town Clerk Records, which easement runs along a presently existing brook and stream and is fifty feet in width, the center line being the center line of the stream.

Rea Lubar, Inc. desires to construct a dwelling which is to be situated over the presently existing brook and in order to do so will request of the City of Danbury a modification of the presently existing easement to allow construction of this dwelling. Franklin Street Extension, Danbury, Connecticut Scale 1"=50 June, 1972", which map was approved by the Planning Commission of the City of Danbury on June 15, 1972 and which map is on file in the Office of the Town Clerk of said Danbury as Map No. 5061, has dedicated and reserved to the CITY OF DANBURY a certain fifty foot (50') easement as shown on said map said easement being entitled "50' Easement Reserved To The City of Danbury With Rights To The City of Danbury To Pass and Repass", which easement is 50 feet in width and runs along a certain brook, as shown on said map, in a general Southwesterly and Southerly direction and,

WHEREAS, REA LUBAR, INC. desires to construct a dwelling on a certain parcel of land shown and designated on the aforesaid Map as "PARCEL 3 3.286 Acres-Accessway .088 AC.", which dwelling will be erected over the brook, as shown on said map, and within the limits of the easement reserved on said Map, and

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WHEREAS, the parties hereto have agreed to modify said easement as hereinafter set forth to relocate the easement to allow the construction of such a dwelling over the brook, and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF DANBURY wishes to obtain a substitute easement to allow the CITY to pass and repass around said proposed dwelling to connect to both ends of the terminated portion of the easement as hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree that said easement heretofore reserved shall be amended and a substitute easement granted to the CITY OF DANBURY all of which is more particularly set forth hereinafter, as follows:

1. 3. REA LUBAR, INC. hereby grants to the CITY OF DANBURY a new easement which consists of the right to pass and repass over an area which by-passes the present easement hereby being relinquished and will connect the present easement on the Southeast of the area being released to the present easement being retained by the CITY OF DANBURY on the Northeast of the area being released. Said right to pass and repass shall be in common with the Grantor of the easement herein, being Rea Lubar, Inc., its successors and assigns, and shall be twenty (20) feet in width and shall be within the area herein bounded and described as follows:

The Executive Board of the Special Police Association of Danbury is requesting the Common Council to investigate the possibility of creating another section to the Danbury Code similar to that of Section 8-18, paragraph number 9, part C. Presently, this section speaks about Volunteer Firemen who are seeking appointment to the regular paid Fire Department. Volunteer Firemen may receive "an additional 10 points to his grade if he has completed two or more years of service....., but shall receive only an additional 5 points if he has completed one year or more, but less than two years of service."

We believe that a new section similar to the one stated above should be instituted for residents who are Special Police. This would encourage experienced Special Police officers to apply to the regular Police force and other residents who are seeking to become a regular Police officer would seek to become a Special Police officer first to gain experience and the extra pointage. 

Persuant to your request, I investigated the possibility of enlarging the present dais to accomodate the large amount of papers each Council member must have for each session.

Due to the structural conditions and limited knee room, it is impossible to add a shelf below the dais on which papers could be sorted.


Therefore, the only answer is to enlarge the top. I suggest that an oak box be fabricated to match the existing dais in grain and color. The box is to be 12 inches deep by 6 inches high with an open side toward the Council members. The box should be fastened to the top of the existing dais cantilevered 9 inches over the front. The existing nameplates would be mounted either on top of the box or on the front of the box. The box should run continuous with the entire length of the dais.


In this manner, the top of the dais will be enlarged by 9 inches in depth plus the top of the box could also be utilized. I do not believe that six inches in height would prohibit spectators in the front rows from viewing the Council members. In addition, the height of the box will shield from view the papers on the dais, thereby presenting a more formal appearance.

I would guess that a cabinet maker would estimate approximately \$1500.00 for the project.





Attached you will find a proposed ordinance that would establish an Ordinance Revision Commission.

As you are no doubt aware, many portions of our Code of Ordinances have become outdated and make for a rather cumbersome compilation.

The adoption of this ordinance would empower a commission of limited duration to review the current code and make recommendations to the common council.

The State of Connecticut has a Law Revision Commission that performs a similar function which is of great aid to the legislature. It is hoped that the proposed municipal commission would serve an equally useful function.

ORDINANCE

Sec. 1. Ordinance Revision Commission-Established; Membership.

There is hereby established by the common council of the City of Danbury, an ordinance revision commission consisting of seven resident electors of the City of Danbury, each of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the common council.

Sec. 2. Duration of Commission.

The commission shall exist for three years from the time of appointment within which time said commission shall report at least six times of its works and findings to the common council.

Sec. 3. Powers and Duties, Purpose.

(a) Powers and Duties. The commission shall have the powers and duties granted to municipal commissions by statute or special act of the State of Connecticut and ordinances of the City of Danbury, subject to the limitation of time imposed by section 2. above.

(b) Purpose. The commission shall examine the current Code of ordinances of the City of Danbury, except zoning ordinances, and make such recommendations as it deems proper to the common council.

Sec. 4. Minority Representation.

The provisions of Section 9-167a of the Connecticut General Statutes relating to minority representation shall apply to said commission.





In light of the Board of Education's current financial position, we are respectfully requesting an additional appropriation of \$60,000.

You are acutely aware of the substantial cut in the Board's budget request for the 1979-1980 school year. We feel that we have made the strongest effort to comply with the mandate of the previous administration. We did reduce staff where possible. We did reduce our discretionary spending to minimum levels. Nonetheless, there were several areas that exceeded our worst expectations despite our legitimate, sincere efforts to provide for them.

In reviewing the financial data available, there are areas that have proved to be particularly burdensome - these being legal fees, public utility services, special education tuition, fuel for buildings and gasoline.

In adopting their 1979-1980 budget, the Board recognized potential problems in all these areas, except legal fees, and attempted to provide for them. The attached chart demonstrates this effort. This effort was at the expense of personnel, programs, supplies, and equipment the Board had considered vital to the educational process. Despite this effort and the difficult decisions which had to be made, the desired results of a balanced budget appear to be beyond our reach.

We are reasonably certain that you and the Common Council can appreciate the problem, understand our efforts, and find it within the capabilities of the city to grant the Board this additional appropriation.

The Board of Education and the Superintendent of Schools give you every assurance that they will continue their efforts to keep expenditures at the lowest possible level in order to minimize the anticipated deficit. We give our assurance, also, that all funds which are not utilized from the supplemental appropriation will be returned to the city.

Your consideration of this matter is greatly appreciated. We sincerely hope that your thoughtful deliberations will result in a favorable decision for the Board. If you need further clarification of any information, please feel free to request it.







Dear Mayor Dyer:

We have completed a financial review of the transportation program for the six months ended December 31, 1979. We find, regretfully, that we must increase the billings to each municipality and agency to cover both increased and anticipated increase in the cost of fuel and repairs for the next six months.

The original estimate to operate the program anticipated total funding requirements of \$74,165 for the total program. This estimate was made in January 1979. We did not, as others did not, anticipate the dramatic increase in fuel costs. In addition, the amount of repair and maintenance expenditures required to keep the state donated vans in operation, has been far more than expected. We now estimate the total funding requirements for the program to be \$83,273 for the year ended.

Your municipality's share of the increased cost is \$5,520.00.

The Red Cross operates the transportation program on a cost recovery basis. We are dependent on the cash flow of the participants to cover the expenses. As such, we would ask that you forward to us the amount due pro-rata with the original estimated payments for 1980.

I would like to remind you that the municipalities are eligible for 50 percent reimbursement from the Federal Government for the expenditures they make for this program. If you have any questions, please contact Carol Bostrom at 792-8200.

(b) "Meeting" means any hearing or other proceeding of a public agency, any convening or assembly of a quorum of a multi-member public agency, and any communication by or to a quorum of a multi-member public agency, whether in person or by means of electronic equipment, to discuss or act upon a matter over which the public agency has supervision, control, jurisdiction or advisory power. "Meeting" shall not include: any chance meeting, or a social meeting neither planned nor intended for the purpose of discussing matters relating to official business; strategy or negotiations with respect to collective bargaining; a caucus of members of a single political party notwithstanding that such members also constitute a quorum of a public agency; an administrative or staff meeting of a single-member public agency; and communication limited to notice of meetings of any public agency or the agendas thereof. "Caucus" means a convening or assembly of the enrolled members of a single political party who are members of a public agency within the state or a political subdivision.

(c) "Person" means natural person, partnership, corporation, association or society.

(d) "Public records or files" means any recorded data or information relating to the conduct of the public's business prepared, owned, used, received or retained by a public agency, whether such data or information be handwritten, typed, tape-recorded, printed, photostated, photographed or recorded by any other method.

(e) "Executive sessions" means a meeting of a public agency at which the public is excluded for one or more of the following purposes: (1) Discussion concerning the appointment, employment, performance, evaluation, health or dismissal of a public officer or employee, provided that such individual may require that discussion be held at an open meeting; (2) strategy and negotiations with respect to pending claims and litigation to which the public agency or a member thereof, because of his conduct as a member of such agency, is a party until such litigation or claim has been finally adjudicated or otherwise settled; (3) matters concerning security strategy or the deployment of security personnel, or devices affecting public security; (4) discussion of the selection of a site or the lease, sale or purchase of real estate by a political subdivision of the state when publicity regarding such site, lease, sale, purchase or construction would cause a likelihood of

increased price until such time as all of the property has been acquired or all proceedings or transactions concerning same have been terminated or abandoned; and (5) discussion of any matter which would result in the disclosure of public records or the information contained therein described in subsection (b) of section 1-19.

'Caucus' means a convening or assembly of the enrolled members of a single political party who are members of a public agency within the state or a political subdivision."

Important Points of Consideration.

1. Total numbers of telephone lines in Danbury Central Office (743,744,748, 792,794,797 0 Total 32,606.
2. Total lines Danbury Main exchange 31717.

Danbury - Brookfield (775) - 78
Danbury - New Fairfield (746) - 811
4. Telephone lines in surrounding communities served by Danbury exchange.
Bethel - 6,498
Ridgefield - 168

Note:

- (A) 889 residents of Danbury with 775 or 746 service would continue to call a seven (7) digit number for emergency service.
- (B) The SNET CO. cannot or will not isolate Danbury residents into a 911 emergency number service; therefore 6,666 Bethel and Ridgefield residents would reach Danbury's emergency center.
- (5) In the opinion of Chief Macedo, Chief Bertalovitz, and Chief of Operations Civil Preparedness P. Winters. The present system is efficient and reliable.
6. The State of Connecticut has passed a bill designed to establish a State-wide emergency service.
7. Costs for a 911 emergency system:
 - A. Telephone system costs - See the attached SNET Co. Cost analysis.
 - B. Manpower analysis:
 1. A 911 system dispatch point at the Police or Fire Headquarters would require a minimum of 8 trained communicators.
Example - To cover 365 fays:
3 persons a day for 5 days - 120 hours
3 persons a day for 8 days - 48 hours
plus 2 trained alternates to work sick days and vacation periods.
 2. A 911 system in a newly established dispatch point.
12 regular and 2 alternates making a total of 14 trained communicators.

Cost per year - Est. Salary.

System #1 8 x 10,000 = 80,000

System #2 14 x 10,000 = 140,000.

Note: The above estimates do not include employee benefits.

7. In late April the State House and Senate passed a bill in Hartford designed to establish a Statewide emergency service.

In light of the above facts it is the recommendation of this committee that the Council take no action on this subject at this time.

A non-profit Corporation, registered in the State of Connecticut, whose purpose is to promote Danbury High School atheletic programs. To promote peer enthusiam and school spirit. To aid the professional instructors in a manner mutually agreed upon.

SUBJECT: LIGHTING AT THE DANBURY HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL FIELD

The purpose and objective of this presentation is for the Danbury High School Boosters Club to obtain permission from the Board of Education, to install and maintain lights at the Danbury High School football field at no cost to the Board of Education or to the Danbury taxpayers.

The Booster Club will enter into a Contract with a qualified Electrical Contractor to install a 400 AMP electrical service to feed the 36 flood-lights which are to be mounted on 6 wooden poles. Our contract will include all labor and materials, digging and grading and seeding. Also, guarantee and adjustment. Complete plans and specifications will be available for the Board of Education to review. The entrance service is sized for future lighting on the baseball field and the tennis courts.

The Booster Club will assume all costs of operating and maintaining of the system until it is turned over to the Board. A fee of \$150.00 will be charged for each use of the lighting system to help defray these costs.

It is also understood that the costs of a referee and police are to be subtracted from the receipts before the 50-50 split. The atheletic director will collect and deposit all funds, furnish the Booster Club with an accounting of the monies for each game. They will then decide, at a joint meeting, what funds will be turned over to the Booster Club.

The ownership and maintenance of the lighting system will remain in the hands of the Booster Club until it is completely paid for, approximately 5 years. At that time, ownership and maintenance will be turned over to the Board of Education and the City of Danbury.

The Danbury High School Boosters Club are not only interested in football; we are interested in all athletics and the Community. We envision the lighting system supporting that interest. A DHS track and field event under lights would draw a bigger crowd than the 15 to 20 parents that currently attend these meets. Perhaps the senior class could have a concert under the lights. The point is, the lights are not just for football. The potential for usage is limitless, the real winners are the kids. Parents are not spending as much time with their family or community as they would like because of the commute and demands on their time. Evening activities would fit the 'choice time' that the parents currently have. The Danbury student would also be a more willing participant.

The purpose of this proposal is not to supplement the present athletic budget but to provide funds to expand the present athletic program so more students will be able to participate.




The Committee voted to recommend four corrective measures:

1. Mr. Schweitzer will inspect the Golden Hill, Breezy Hill intersection to determine if resurfacing could improve the traffic conditions.
2. Mr. Fusek will be contacted in regard to installing protective poles in the front of 3 residences.
3. Chief Macedo will be requested to provide an enforcement drive on Golden Hill Road in order to reduce the possibility of an accident. The Police Chief will also be requested to institute a traffic count which will yield further information as requested by the City Engineer.
4. Any corrective measures, as determined necessary by the City Engineer, including bridge reconstruction and the modification of the angle at the intersection of Breezy Hill, will be cost estimated and funding will be recommended for inclusion in the Capital Budget for 1981.


The Sewer and Water extension committee has met and reviewed the above petition with the City Engineer and has also reviewed a recommendation for approval, from the Planning Commission.


It is the recommendation of this committee that the petition be granted with the following conditions and restrictions:


1. The petitioner shall bear all costs relative to the installation of said sewer and water lines.
2. The petitioner shall submit as-built drawings of this extension, prepared by a licensed Connecticut Land Surveyor, for approval by the City Engineer.
3. Detailed Engineering Plans and Specifications are to be approved by the City Engineer and the Superintendent of Public Utilities prior to the start of construction.
4. If required, a Warranty Deed in a form satisfactory to the Corporation Counsel shall be executed by the petitioner conveying to the City of Danbury all right, title, interest and privileges required hereunder, and said Deed shall be held in escrow for recording upon completion of installation.
5. That upon completion of installation, title to said sewer and water line within City Streets, and any necessary documents be granted to the City in a form which is acceptable to the City Engineer and Corporation Counsel.
6. The petitioner shall convey ownership of and easements to all or such portions of the sewer and water lines as the City Engineer's office determines are of potential benefit to other landowners in the City. Should another, other than the petitioner hold title to any land involved in the approval, then consent prior to any installation or hook-up shall be furnished in a form satisfactory to the City Engineer and Corporation Counsel.
7. No Certificate of Occupancy shall be issued until the above requested forms, documents, plans, etc. are received and the City owns the extended sewer and water lines.







RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Danbury:

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Danbury (hereafter called the "Agency") has received an offer from Guilherme F. and Aurora A. Bernardino to purchase and develop Disposition Parcel S/20-1 in the Mid-Town East Neighborhood Development Project, Conn. A-4; and

WHEREAS, Section 8-137 of Chapter 130 of the Connecticut General Statutes, Revision of 1958, as amended, requires that a redevelopment agency obtain the approval and concurrence of the legislative body of the municipality prior to entering into a contract for the sale or lease of land in an urban renewal project area; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has requested the approval of the Common Council of the City of Danbury of the aforesaid land disposition and has requested authorization for the Mayor of the City of Danbury and the Chairman of the Agency to execute a Land Disposition Agreement on behalf of the City and the Agency, respectively and has further requested authorization from the Mayor of the City of Danbury to execute and deliver the Deed of Conveyance for Disposition Parcel S/20-1:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Danbury:

1. That the Mayor of the City of Danbury and the Chairman of the Agency are hereby authorized and directed to execute said Land Disposition Agreement on behalf of the City of Danbury and the Agency, respectively; and
2. The Mayor of the City of Danbury is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Deed of Conveyance for Disposition Parcel S/20-1.
3. That the authority and direction herein granted and given shall be conditioned upon the relocation of the driveway servicing the subject parcel as far as possible from the intersection of Main and Liberty Streets; and further conditioned upon the establishment of certain landscaping buffers in accordance with the recommendations of the Tree Warden of the City of Danbury.

COMMON COUNCIL NOISE POLLUTION COMMITTEE - MINUTES AND PROGRESS REPORT



The committee is also awaiting a reply from the Federal E.P.A. in Boston. No action could be taken at this time and the committee hereby requests an extension of time.


