On June 12, 1980, the protective vests committee of the Common Council, met at 7:00 P.M. in room 432 at City Hall. Committee members present were Councilmen White, Torian and Turk. Also in attendance under ex-officio status was Councilman Boynton.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 P.M. by Councilman White. Two letters were presented to the committee by Councilman White. One of the letters was from the Protect A Life Fund's Chairman, Mr. Rocco D. Bruno, advising the committee that the fund no longer seeks the City's assistance with regard to funding, as their sixteen civic organizations (sponsors) are handling the financial and tax matters themselves.

Also presented was a letter from Chief Nelson Macedo withdrawing his April 28th request to Mayor James E. Dyer.

In lieu of the above letters, a motion was made by Councilman Torian and seconded by Councilman Turk to take no action and dissolve the committee at this time. Motion carried.



DANBURY — Sixteen local organizations are participating in a drive to buy bullet-proof vests for the city's policemen.

Organizers expect the drive to hit its peak this month as they attempt to raise more than \$10,000 to buy 110 vests.

Rocco Bruno, an organizer, calls it a chance for city residents and businessmen to say "thank you" to the police who risk their lives to protect the city.

Bruno said he started his campaign early this year but things moved slowly because he is not well known and is not connected with any of the city's service organizations.

"When I started calling and talking to people, they said, 'Who's this guy?'" Bruno said.

Eventually he was able to convince local organizations the project is legitimate and worth supporting. So far, 16 organizations have offered to help, Bruno said. He said others may join later.

The organizations have formed the "Protect A Life" fund, which will collect money and purchase the vests. Bruno, who has been a Danbury resident for 25 years, is one of three fund trustees. The other trustees are Richard Pimental of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, and Anthony Miranda of the Sons of Portugal.

According to Bruno, one of the trustees' main jobs is to make sure none of the money collected is used for organizational expenses.

"No wages, no telephone bills or anything like that. We want 100 percent of the money to be used for the vests," Bruno said.

Bruno said he is convinced the project is worthwhile even though few police have been shot in the line of duty in Danbury. The only police officer shot on the job in the past 10 years was Randolph Salazar who was shot in the leg in March 1977 when he attempted to stop an alleged robber near the Palace Theatre.

"What do they want to do, wait until someone gets killed?" Bruno asked, referring to skeptics of the vest program.

Bruno said he got the idea for the vests after seeing a picture of a policeman who had just been shot while wearing a vest.

"He had a big bruise, but he was smiling," Bruno said.

He then started a program in New Milford where he is a Rotary Club member. The club sponsored a fund-raiser which brought in enough money to purchase 19 vests for the New

Milford police, Bruno said.

But in Danbury, the goal is much larger — vests for each of the department's 110 sworn employees, according to Lt. Charles Gallucci, who is acting as the department's liaison with the fund drive.

Gallucci said the department is not taking an active part in the drive, but that he is helping the organizers make sure they do not violate the complex laws governing this type of activity.

Police officials, meanwhile, say the vests can be a very useful device. Police Chief Nelson Macedo compared the vests to a life jacket for a fisherman.

Assistant Chief F. Leo Gantert noted that new model vests are much more practical than the older, more bulky ones. He said modern vests can be worn summer and winter with minimal discomfort to the wearer.

In addition to the Elks and Sons of Portugal, the Junior Women's Club and the Junior Service League have been among the earliest supporters of the program, Bruno said.

He said the other supporting organizations include: Afro-American Men's Association; American Legion; Arion Singing Society; American Association of Retired Persons, chapters 1067 and 1847; Barber Shop Chorus; Exchange Club; Kiwanis Club; Marine Corps League; Men's Club of the United Jewish Center; Polish-American Citizen's Club, and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.




The committee was made aware that lack of supplemental funds would cause a lay-off in all clerical and custodial staff from the eighteenth of June.

O R D I N A N C E

Section 1. Boards and Commissions, Attendance.

(a) The chairman or his designee of every board or commission empowered by the City of Danbury acting through the common council shall cause an attendance record of each and every meeting of such commission or board to be completed.

(b) Such attendance record shall indicate commission or board members present and absent, and shall be filed with the city clerk for public inspection.

Section 2. Excessive absence, procedure.

(a) The chairman or his designee of every board or commission empowered by the City of Danbury shall by writing notify the Mayor of any commission member who has missed three consecutive meetings or one third of all meetings within a calendar year without excuse.

(b) The Mayor, after receipt of notification of absence as defined in section (a), may deem the commission member to have resigned and fill the vacancy according to law.

(c) A commission member may appeal any decision made by the Mayor under section (b) by informing the Mayor and the respective board or commission chairman of his objection to the decision within fifteen days of the Mayor's determination that the individual has resigned.

(d) The Board of Appeals for an objection filed under section (c) shall consist of the President of the common council, the corporation counsel, and the respective board or commission chairman.

(e) This article shall not apply to the common council, the board of education, or the zoning commission.
