RE: Monthly report for April 2010

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the City Council:

I am pleased to present to you the Public Works Department report for the month of April.

April is the month in which we change-out our equipment from snow and ice to spring clean-up programs. The Highway sanders have now been removed from all of the trucks, cleaned and stored for the season. The sanders, as well as the all season bodies, will go through a complete inspection and maintenance program over the next four months. The sweeping program was also put into full swing.

In May we are planning to have our Third Annual Public Works Awareness and Employee Recognition Day. All divisions will be showcasing the tasks that they perform for the Public Works Department. The Hat City Public Works Department is a very visible department, and based on the current work load, it is critical that all divisions work well together to be an effective and efficient organization. Holding an event like this fosters team work and staff recognition and goes a long way toward loyalty and dedication to the City.

All Divisions in the month of April were completely devoted to assisting with the clean up of the oil spill at Broadview Middle School. The clean up was managed in-house and after a few strategic changes in contractors and dumping site, we were able to take this almost \$1M project and bring it in

just under \$400K. We also sought FEMA funds and are awaiting news on whether or not a portion of the work will be covered.

I am very proud of my team and what they were able to accomplish in just a few short weeks. Special thanks go to my division heads and their superior communication skills and team work.

Construction Services report submitted by Thomas H. Hughes III, Superintendent:

Backus Avenue Bridge over Miry Brook: The project was bid in December with a spring construction start. We coordinated with Yankee Gas Co. and CL&P for the relocation of the utility poles. There should be no utility relocation issues during construction. We met with the low bidder, Hemlock Construction, and performed an in depth scope review item by item. We received approval from ConnDot to award the project to Hemlock Construction. The pre-construction meeting was held on March 24, 2010 and the notice to proceed was issued on March 29, 2010 following the signing the contract. The contractor has mobilized to the project and the construction is underway with a seven month construction period.

Kenosia Spray Park: We met with the Public Utilities consultant, LGB, and forwarded information for the change of use permit required by the State Department of Health due to the proximity of the drinking water wells. LGB has answered all the State Department of Health's comments. The final Drinking Water Quality Management Plan for construction to the State Department of Health has been submitted.

Williams Street: The notice to proceed was issued on August 12, 2009 to Reliable Excavation, the low bidder. The contractor mobilized to the site on August 27, 2009. The drainage phase has been completed. The sidewalks & curbing have been installed on Williams Street, project limit to project limit. We were able to field adjust the road grade along the northerly side of Williams Street from the West Wooster St. intersection down the hill, successfully removing the existing eight inch crown in the road. We have met with each homeowner within the project limits explaining the project and grade changes which will require the City to enter their property to grade. This work will encompass matching the driveways and front walkways to the new grades. Each property owner has signed a temporary right to enter, which includes a hold harmless clause to the City and its agents. I would like to also express that the entire neighborhood and property owners have expressed their thanks to the City for this project. The project is at substantial completion with several small items to be completed in the spring. The contractor has remobilized and will be completing several small items remaining.

Homeless Shelter: Construction Services, with the Health Department Director, Scott Leroy, developed a scope of work for a CDGB project. The project encompassed installing a video system for security and make energy efficient improvements to the existing structure. The bids were opened. Reliable was the low bidder and the project has been completed on time and within budget.

B.I. Access Project -06-06: Earthmovers has remobilized to the site in the beginning of April, and continues to move forward with the remaining work. We expect a mid summer completion of the project.

White Street ARRA Project

The contract was bid. A&J Paving was the low bidder. We are awaiting approvals from the DOT to award. Once Engineering has received the approvals from the DOT, we will hold a pre-construction meeting.

Broadview Oil Spill

We have been working with CT DEP and our consultant and have completed the remediation work. With the use of our in-house forces, we diverted and managed the storm water from entering existing contaminated swales containing the contamination. This work was performed by the City of Danbury Highway Department. We also changed the spill response contractor and contracted directly with the soil disposal facility. The Highway Division is starting the restoration work. All the divisions of the Public Works have given a great effort completing as much of the work as possible in house, which has significantly reduced the cost of this cleanup. The Engineering Division has designed the new drainage in-house and all related survey work was done in-house by the Engineering Division.

Engineering report submitted by Farid L. Khouri, P.E., City Engineer:

Assessment Projects:

- Oak Lane and Haddy Lane Sanitary Sewer: Expanded sewer project. Revised design completed. Mail survey will be sent out next month.
- Alexander D: In-house design and estimate are complete, and mail survey will be sent out within the next couple of months.
- Fairway Drive, Royal Pine Drive, Country Way, Hausmann Road Sanitary Sewer Assessment: In-house design and estimate are complete. Mail survey to be sent out within the next couple of months.
- Shannon Ridge Road, Fairlawn Avenue, Edgewood Street and Westville Avenue Extension Sanitary Sewer and Water Main Extension for Fairlawn Avenue and Myrtle Avenue: In-house design is complete, and estimate will be done soon.
- Ivy Lane, Cedar Street and Sylvan Drive Water Main Extension: Started work on preliminary design.
- Deepwood Drive Sanitary Sewer Extension: Started work on preliminary design.
- Hawthorne Terrace Water: New backup well drilled. Well test results to be reviewed for adequacy next month.

Traffic Division: In addition to routine activities of repair and maintenance of traffic control signal devices and pavement markings, the Division is currently working on the design of Backus Avenue traffic signal synchronization from Sugar Hollow Road to Kenosia Avenue (project designed in-house and funded by the State of Connecticut). The project involves modernization of all traffic signals including installation of state-of-the-art traffic control devices. All traffic signals along the corridor shall be interconnected by fiber optic communication and their operations controlled in the Traffic Control Center at City Hall. Additionally, the Traffic Division is working on maintenance of the City-wide communication network, optimization of traffic signal synchronization operations as well as design of the intersection of Germantown Road and Hospital Avenue. Other duties and

responsibilities include review and approval of land-use development plans and coordination activities with the State of Connecticut Department of Transportation and HVCEO on planning, funding, design and construction of all transportation projects within the City.

Staff Engineers:

- Review various site plans, water and sewer applications, special exception applications, and subdivision applications for land-use approval of on-going development projects throughout the City.
- Field inspection of sanitary sewer, water mains and new roads are performed regularly on various developments.
- Reviews of long-standing drainage problems, including site visits, analysis and design.

Survey crew: Currently working on survey for West Street around railroad bridge, Broadview Middle School oil spill, Backus Avenue Signal Coordination, Lincoln Avenue Paving and Drainage Project, Topstone Drive, Verification of R.O.W. on tree issues and locating storm drainage outfalls for the entire City using GPS equipment.

Lincoln Avenue: Design was completed and project was bid out. Bids will be opened May 20, 2010. Funding is part of ARRA/CDBG/City Bond. Our office has prepared the final drainage system design to collect the storm water runoff along Lincoln Avenue and realign the road.

Stimulus road packages: Bids were opened, and we are reviewing award documents with the State for approval. Construction should begin in June 2010 and last for three months.

Highway Department report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:

The Highway Division welcomed the month of April after a very icy winter.

Work continues on the installation of new drainage at Broadview Junior High School, Danbury High School and Chuck Wagon Lane. The Rogers Park Little League field drainage work was completed.

New signs were installed at six (6) locations and numerous repairs were made throughout the City.

The Annual Spring Leaf Bag Pick-up is in full swing and will continue until May 28th. Street sweeping is underway with two (2) sweepers out daily, weather permitting. Two pothole crews are out every day filling and patching.

Weather permitting, we have been cleaning catch basing and canvassing for litter.

Parks Maintenance submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:

The Parks Maintenance Division staff geared up for the coming spring season by starting with the downtown area. Sand and debris will be removed from all of the City building lots and sidewalks.

Preparation of the playing fields is in full swing for the upcoming season. An extra effort was made to prepare the fields at Danbury High School for the Special Olympics scheduled for next month.

The Division was pleased to assist the Forestry Division with traffic control after some of the severe rain and wind storms which moved into our area in April.

Forestry Division report submitted by Mark Miller, Foreman Forestry Department:

April is a very important month for the Forestry Division.

Danbury was named Tree City for the 20th year and to celebrate, we planted two trees on Lions Way with the assistance of the Lions Club. The Tree City recognition was received from Chris Donnelly from the State of Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection.

To celebrate Arbor Day, two trees were planted with the help of the Garden Club at Kenosia Park. Next the crew went to Park Avenue School to assist with the planting of a Sugar maple. The students had a great time planting the maple tree.

Many other tasks were performed during the month of April. The Forestry Division finished cutting back at Broadview Middle School to facilitate the oil spill clean up. Pruning and cut backs were performed at Kenosia Cemetery to ease maintenance and enhance the cemetery. Trees were removed on Lincoln Avenue for the roadway improvements and drainage work. The crew also installed banners at the library for the CT Film Festival.

Trees were removed at the following locations: Allison Lane, Park Avenue School, Rockwell Road and Starrs Plain Road. CL&P assisted with some of the tree removals.

The Division responded to tree calls at the following locations: Miry Brook Road, Great Plain Road, Middle River Road and Joe's Hill Road.

The crew is also starting to prune all of the large pin oaks and elm trees on Main St. in preparation for the Memorial Day Parade.

Public Buildings report submitted by Rick Palanzo, Superintendent of Public Buildings:

The first of our new mechanics started in April, his name is William Schweitzer. Mr. Schweitzer holds a contractors license in Plumbing and fire protection systems as well as a limited heating license. This level of expertise will enhance our ability to respond to requests for repairs and maintenance without calling in outside contractors for routine work. Our second employee is due to begin in a couple of weeks.

EECBG Grant: On March 31, 2010 our application was approved by Department of Energy personnel at the Oak Ridge Tennessee facility. The projects we presented were well received. Source One, our grant administration consultant has begun to package the projects by type and will have the first set ready for proposals by the end of May...

City Hall: The Otto Company has installed the required ducts designed by Friar Associates Engineering Services for supply air to the generator room. The generator project is now complete. The generator has sufficient ventilation to operate in the harshest of conditions to provide City Hall with full operating power.

Library: The HVAC upgrade Phase II to replace the air handlers and the chiller at the Danbury Public Library is in full swing. The air handlers, controls, ductwork and piping will be completed by the end of May, but the chiller will not be delivered until the beginning of June. The air handlers are state of the art and energy efficient, which will supply the Library with good ventilation and fresh air at a lower cost than the old units. When the chiller arrives and is installed, the Library will have a new energy efficient system supplying cooling and fresh air through the entire library.

The Honeywell WebStat device has been installed in the Library Tech Center and will assist us in the remote monitoring and energy management of the LTC, as it does at Veterans Hall and Elmwood Hall.

Old Jail Building: The old accumulated debris has been removed from the old jail building. The Danbury Museum has begun to move museum archival material into the third floor which has been designated for their storage.

Requests for Maintenance and Repairs: Attached please find the statistical analysis for repairs and maintenance work that the Public Buildings Mechanics engaged in during the month of April. In the month of April we received 168 new work requests and completed 194 work requests. In reviewing this report, you will find the repair time that was expended in major work categories, (current month versus previous month). Also listed is the total number of work order hours completed, (current month versus the previous month).

Our department was heavily engaged in plumbing repairs of the City's buildings and schools with a total of 258.75 man-hours dedicated to this service. The next largest area of concentration was in electrical repair work, utilizing 199.00 man-hours of labor. Mechanical work came in as the third highest category with 58.00 man-hours.
