Dear Council Members:

I hereby submit for your confirmation the appointment and promotion of the following accomplished members of the Police Department to the position of Police Sergeant:

**Detective Joseph A. LeRose, III** – Detective LeRose began his career with the Danbury Police Department on February 11, 1985 and was promoted to Detective on April 4, 2006. He is also a Certified ICE 287(g) Task Force Officer. Throughout his career, Detective LeRose has received numerous letters of Appreciation and Commendation including a Medal of Bravery for his involvement and response to a double homicide/suicide incident where officers were fired upon while assisting injured parties in August 1989; and a Medal of Bravery for his actions during his response to a domestic disturbance in progress involving an armed, violent male, who was ultimately subdued and disarmed. Detective LeRose also received a Medal of Meritorious Service for his assistance and tireless efforts in a homicide investigation resulting in the arrest and indictment by a Grand Jury of two suspects in February 2009.

**Detective Vincent P. Daniello** – Detective Daniello began his career on May 15, 2000 and was promoted to a Detective in the Youth Bureau on April 3, 2008. Detective Daniello also serves as Part-Time Evidence Technician; a member of the department's SWAT Team - Emergency Services Unit; and a leader of the Honor Guard Unit. Detective Daniello has received numerous awards throughout his career including the Exchange Club Officer of the Year and Chief's Achievement Award in 2008 for his commitment and dedication to involving himself in a variety of fundraising activities benefiting the community. He also received the Exceptional Police Service Award for his professional response to a call resulting in the removal of drugs and an illegal handgun from the streets in August 2004. Additionally, he received a Meritorious Citation for securing information at the scene of a Robbery Homicide in December 2004 that resulted in the suspects being arrested on Felony Murder charges as well as numerous larceny and robbery charges.

**Police Officer Andrew Corrado** – Officer Corrado began his career with the Danbury Police Department on May 9, 2005. Officer Corrado has received several letters of Appreciation & Commendation including the Exceptional Police Service Award for his actions ensuring that a wandering, lost male was located quickly during frigid temperatures in December 2006. Officer Corrado also serves as a Part-Time Evidence Technician and a Field Training Officer.


**Police Officer Peter Tragni** – Officer Tragni began his career with the Danbury Police Department on July 18, 1988 and became a D.A.R.E. Program Officer on January 27, 1995. Officer Tragni has participated in Special Olympics fundraising activities, was a member of the DPD Recruiting Team and served as a VALE Domestic Violence Officer. Officer Tragni also received many Letters of Appreciation and Commendation including the Medal of Bravery for his involvement and response to a double homicide/suicide incident where officers were fired upon while assisting injured parties on August 13, 1989.

**Police Officer Augusto "Javier" Lowe** – Officer Lowe began his career with the Danbury Police Department on May 24, 1996. He is a Certified Telecommunicator/Dispatcher and has received several Letters of Appreciation and Commendation including the Medal of Meritorious Service for his assistance on June 29, 1998 in covering a vehicle that was pulled over containing suspects who had pointed a gun at a female. The suspect was a previously convicted felon. He also received a Medal of Bravery for his actions in 2003 for investigating a road rage incident and received a Life Saving Medal for his response and administration of first aid to a medical emergency which was originally thought to be a burglary call in March 2005.

It is quite evident that these highly qualified and skilled individuals will be a tremendous asset to the Danbury Police Department and to the citizens of Danbury. I am proud and honored to submit their confirmation for promotion to the position of Police Sergeant.
