**RE: Monthly Report for October 2014**

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the City Council:

I am pleased to present the Public Works Department report for the month of October.

Although the weather has been warm, the Public Works Department has been preparing for our winter work. The sand and salt storage facility has received deliveries of materials and the Highway Division is mixing the sand and salt in preparation for any early November storms that may occur. Maintenance on all of the snowplowing and de-icing equipment continues by the Equipment Maintenance Division. The Highway Division continues to pack as many paving and drainage projects into this year as the weather allows.

It was my pleasure to host the Citizens Government Academy at the Public Works Complex on October 27<sup>th</sup>. Each of the Division Managers gave a brief overview of their departments and some of the projects currently under way. The participants were then invited on a brief tour of the sand and salt storage facility and highway garage. The final stop was the sewage treatment plant where the group learned about the nuts and bolts of the operation. We are always happy to have the opportunity to educate the public about what we do at Public Works and let them see firsthand how their tax dollars are spent.

Please take a few moments to review the Division reports for a full scope of the many activities and projects that the Public Works Department is engaged in.

**Construction Services Report submitted by Thomas Hughes III, Superintendent:**

**Osborne Street at Fifth Street Traffic Signal Installation:** ConnDot project 34-344, Construction Services has been approved by ConnDot to perform the contract administration and inspection of the project, eliminating the need to hire an outside consultant. The contractor, A.M. Rizzo, has completed the punch list and the project is complete. We are in the process of closing the project out with ConnDot.

**School Additions: Shelter Rock, Stadley Rough, Park Avenue and Mill Ridge Intermediate:** Construction Services is administrating the school addition projects. All four of the schools have been issued Certificates of Occupancy allowing the schools to be occupied.

**Mill Ridge:** Rizzo Corporation is moving forward with completing the punch list.

**Stadley Rough School:** Rizzo Corporation is moving forward completing the punch list.

**Shelter Rock School:** Rizzo Corporation is moving forward completing the punch list.

**Park Avenue School:** Worth Construction has been issued an extensive punch list and there are several open items needing completion.

**Spring Street Sidewalk & Paving:** The contract has been awarded to GEG Construction and a pre-construction meeting was held on August 28, 2014. The contractor will be issued a Notice to Proceed. The project is 98% complete, substantially complete on schedule and within budget. This project was designed in-house by the City of Danbury Engineering Division and is being administrated by the Construction Services Division.

**Foster Street Sidewalks, Drainage & Paving:** This project was bid and awarded to GEG Construction with a fall start. The project was designed in-house by the City of Danbury Engineering Division and will be administrated by the Construction Services Division. As like the Spring Street project, the design and administration of the project will be performed in-house reducing the project costs. The contractor was issued a notice to proceed on 10/31/14.

**School Playgrounds:** South Street, King Street and Morris Street School playgrounds designs have been completed. The playgrounds were delivered on 11/04/14; the existing playground equipment has been removed. South Street School, Morris Street and King Street playscape's have been installed. The contractor is also repairing existing playground equipment presently.

**Mill Ridge Artificial Field:** Working with the Engineering Division on the conceptual field design. Friar Associates has been hired to design the field. The geotechnical engineer will be onsite 12/01/14 taking soil borings.

**Clear Brook Road Bridge:** The Phase II deck replacement has been completed and the road reopened to traffic. The guiderail has been installed and rip-rap slope protection as well.

**Engineering Report submitted by Farid L. Khouri, P.E., City Engineer:**

The following assessment projects are the only projects pending on the list based on residents' petitions:

1. Butternut Lane, Bayberry Lane and Boxwood Lane Sanitary Sewer Extension: Working on preliminary design and cost estimate.
2. Hawley Road Extension Sanitary Sewer Extension: Working on preliminary design and cost estimate.

**East Franklin Street Bridge/Sanitary Sewer Pump Station:** The bridge work and above ground pump station work have been completed. Generator work has been completed and we are testing the equipment before we terminate the existing sewer line in the brook and the switch over has been completed.

**Spring Street:** The project consists of neighborhood enhancement work to sidewalk and pavement improvements. Sidewalk work has been completed. Project is approximately 98% complete.

**Foster Street:** In house design and survey to Foster Street from West Street to West Wooster Street, Boughton Street and Bank Street were completed and the project was awarded after the City reviewed the bids. CDBG approved funding and start of construction will commence next month, weather dependent, and will resume in the spring, 2015.

**Traffic Light – Lake Avenue/Shannon Ridge:** The City bid the project and selected a local contractor to perform the work. Preconstruction meeting was conducted and work is underway. The project will be completed late spring 2015.

**Still River Channel Maintenance:** Property owners along the Still River Channel, who will be affected by and where access will be required, have been notified and permission to access the Still River Channel right of way through their property has been requested. We have secured the sign offs from property owners. 95% of the work for Phase I has been completed and we are preparing the necessary documents for Phase II.

**Clear Brook Bridge:** Bridge had deteriorated and required the City to make temporary repairs for both sides of the bridge. Work has been completed and the bridge was opened to full traffic.

**Mill Plain All Purpose Field:** The City has selected an architect to design a synthetic all purpose field on the grounds of the new Westside Middle School Academy. Design and permits should be completed by spring, 2015. The field should be ready for use at the beginning of the new school year 2015/2016 which is in September 2015.

**Traffic Engineer and his Technicians:** are reviewing various land-use development plans and are handling public complaints, routine repairs and maintenance of traffic control signal devices and pavement markings.

**Staff Engineers:** are reviewing various site plans, water and sewer applications, special exception applications, and subdivision applications for various land-use approvals of on-going development projects throughout the City. Field inspections of sanitary sewer, water mains and new roads are performed regularly on various developments. The Staff Engineers also review various drainage problems which may include site visits, analysis and design.

**Survey Crew** verifies various R.O.W., and prepares surveys and easements for in-house design of City Projects, and assists other divisions in locating utilities in the field.

**Highway Division Report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:**

October was a very busy month for the Highway Division. The construction crews were involved in catch basin repairs and upgrades on Ken Oaks, Glen Hill, Briar Ridge Road, Kimberly Terrace, and Boulevard Drive. New Drainage was installed on East Lake Road.

The crews were heavily involved in paving projects. Roads were trim milled before paving on Ken Oaks, Kimberly Terrace, Starrs Plain Road and sections of Briar Ridge Road. The paving crew paved Ledgemere Drive, Strawberry Lane and Briar Patch Lane, Old Ball Pond Road, Ken Oaks, Kimberly Terrace and sections of West King Street, Starrs Plain Road and Briar Ridge Road. A drainage pipe replacement project at 43 Beaver Brook Road was also paved. Curbs and aprons were installed and repaired in many locations. Catch basin repairs were paved on Skyline Drive, Memorial Drive, Boulevard Drive, Sandpit Road and New Street. An equipment operator and excavator were deployed to assist the Public Utilities with a pipe replacement project on Madison Avenue.

Two crews are dispatched on an almost daily basis patching pothole and repairing curbs and aprons. The sign crew was busy with the installation of twenty new signs at several locations, in addition to numerous repairs due to accidents or vandalism. The vactor truck was deployed to clean out several catch basins within the City and all of the catch basins in the Public Works Complex. Staff and the garbage truck are dispatched daily to empty trash cans and pick up litter and illegal dumping. The crew continues to mow intersections and remedy site line issues. The recycling truck is out daily and remains a very popular stop for the residents.

**Parks Maintenance Report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:**

In the month of October the Parks Maintenance Division continued with the mowing and park maintenance programs at the City parks and schools. The flower beds were watered, weeded and roto-tilled as needed. The fields at Rogers Park, Hatters Park, Danbury High School and elementary schools were dragged and lined as needed. The soccer fields at Kenosia Park, Broadview, Mill Ridge, Hayestown and on the west side are painted regularly. Crews also mowed and performed trimming on Main Street, West Street, City Hall, Library, Police Department and all city fire houses.

Playground equipment was removed at South Street, King Street and Morris Street Schools in order that new equipment can be installed. Playgrounds at the schools and parks are mulched, inspected and repairs performed when needed to provide a safe play area for the children.

On Fridays and Mondays the division is busy with preparation and clean-up at the City Center Green and Kennedy Park as well as Post Office Walk and Ives Street for the weekend activities in these areas. Trash removal at City parks and playgrounds is done on a regular basis.

#### **Forestry Division Report submitted by Mark Miller, Foreman:**

The Forestry Division was involved in several projects during the month of October. The crew performed pruning on Ives Street at the City Center Green, Tarrywile Park and Mill Ridge School. Removals were done in Rogers Park at the rose arbor, Patriot Drive, at the old school house on Dixon Drive, Barnum Road, Hayestown Avenue School, Brushy Hill Road, Elm Street, Kenosia Park, Harding Place and at the Sleepy Hollow Garage. Sight line improvements were made on Maple Avenue and at Danbury High School.

The Division responded to tree calls at the following locations: Delno Drive, Chambers Road, Bayberry Lane, Segar Street, Brushy Hill Road, Terrace Street, Ken Oaks Drive, Old Shelter Rock Road, Summit Street and Nabby Road.

The crew from the Forestry Division attended a chain saw and electrical hazards awareness program in Southbury. The workshop was highly informative and we learned many new safety tips and regulations regarding both chain saw operation and safety procedures around lines in emergency situations.

#### **Public Buildings Report submitted by Rick Palanzo, Superintendent**

**City Hall:** The Phase I & II city hall boiler project is in full swing. The demolition work has been completed. The defunct boiler has been removed and they are working to repair the remaining steam boiler. The replacement boiler and water heater have been ordered and are anticipated to be delivered to City Hall by November 21, 2014. I anticipate completion by early December.

**Farrington Woods Park – Westside Open Space:** Our next project at Farrington Woods will be to take care of the roof, siding and porch of the main house, as well as deteriorating roofs on some of the other residential buildings. This project will begin in the spring of 2015.

**Danbury Public Schools:** The transformer project at Danbury High School, which we intended to place on hold and rebid next summer, has been awarded to the low bidder. The low bidder agreed to hold his price until next summer, which will allow us sufficient time to request the funds required to complete this project in our next capital budget. This act will guarantee that this project will be completed before the children come back to school in August 2015. We appreciate the cooperation of the Purchasing, Corporation Counsel and Finance departments in helping to make this possible.

The three school buildings, which required new roofs, Morris Street School, Great Plain School and the Educational Services Center are 99% complete. The remaining work includes the submission of the required paperwork and guarantees. The roofs are performing well with no leaks!

Great Plain School required some plumbing and steam fitting work in the boiler room to make the rebuilt boilers operate more effectively and efficiently. This work began and was completed this month. The school is prepared for the winter!

**Library:** We are negotiating with a prospective vendor to operate the café. The license agreement was referred to a subcommittee for review.

The second floor of the Library will receive a fresh coat of paint to liven up the children's library and the administrative offices and workroom. The work was bid in September and was awarded and begun in October, the work should be completed by mid November. The Library staff participated in the selection of the paint colors!

**Old Library:** The replacement of the first floor heat pumps was sent to the council for approval of the project and to apply for LOCIP funds. This project will remove old inefficient heat pumps and replace them with new high efficiency heat pumps. It will improve the comfort of the workspace and do it at a lower cost! When we receive LOCIP approval, we will begin the bid process.

**Public Works Complex:** We have hired Kuegler Associates to design one emergency generation system for the entire Public Works Complex. This design work will take place over the autumn months and bidding will take place in the winter months with actual work to begin in the spring. This project will eliminate smaller stand-alone generators in favor of one large efficient generator that will supply the public works complex (upper level). The contract has been signed and design work has begun.

**General:** The Public Buildings team is working on these issues and projects:

- 1) The underground heating fuel storage tanks that we wrote about are being reviewed by professional engineers (TRC) to provide their engineering prowess in this endeavor. TRC is well into their design process and we will use above ground tanks wherever possible. The TRC site sketches have been approved and they are now finalizing the engineering to prepare for bidding. It is still our intent to bid the work in the winter for installation next July pending approval of the capital budget request.

- 2) The Public Building mechanics have winterized the seasonal parks buildings and the city fountains; and began to prepare the heating systems as the winter season approaches.
- 3) This year the Public Buildings mechanics have assumed the bulk of the mechanical preventative maintenance that was performed formerly by the Honeywell Corporation. Currently we are performing preventative maintenance on all rooftop exhaust fans and fresh air supply systems.

**Requests for Maintenance Service:** Attached please find the statistical report of repairs and maintenance work that the Public Buildings Mechanics engaged in during the month of October 2014.

In the month of October we received 227 new work requests and completed 191 work requests. In reviewing this report, you will find the repair time that was expended in major work categories. Also listed is the total number of work order hours completed.

Public Building mechanics were engaged in general Plumbing repairs with a total of 293.50 person-hours dedicated to this service. The next largest area of concentration was in General Maintenance work, utilizing 240.00 person-hours of labor. Carpentry repairs came in as the third highest category with 167.00 person-hours.
