

Dear Mayor and Members of the Common Council:


As part of the Common Council meeting agenda for August, item #13 was referred to me for a report. This item pertained to providing and designating parking spaces for 2 wheel vehicles. After speaking with the Director of the Parking Authority and consulting with our Traffic Engineer, we all agree to provide more opportunities for parking 2 wheel vehicles as long as we do not displace any existing on-street parking spaces. We will also work together to implement more bicycle racks. Currently three locations have been identified. These locations are as follows:

- At the corner of Kennedy Avenue and Main Street adjacent to the Post Office mail boxes,
- Along the Post Office Walk between the Main Street Post Office and Tuxedo Junction Restaurant
- On the west side of Main Street, just northerly of Library Place.


The Public Works Department and Parking Authority will take a fresh look at all of the on-street parking in the downtown area and any other locations which may benefit from these types of parking spaces.

Dear Mayor Boughton and members of the Common Council,

On August 28th Councilman Michael Calandrino met with the Parking Authority Board of Directors and myself to discuss his plan to designate parking spaces for two-wheel vehicles.

The idea was favorably received and we have begun to implement some changes. Two bicycle racks have been ordered with one being installed at each parking garage. Additionally, a motorcycle parking area has been designated inside the Patriot Garage. Motorcycle parking will continue to be available in all of our metered areas.

We have been working with Traffic Engineer Abdul Mohamed to identify additional areas within City Center that will accommodate bicycles and motorcycles without removing or displacing current vehicle parking. In order to safely utilize these areas, additional funding will be required to purchase bicycle racks and signage.
