

Our department was heavily engaged in plumbing services of the City's buildings and schools with a total of 281.50 man-hours dedicated to this service. The next largest area of concentration was in mechanical repairs, utilizing 263.00 man-hours of labor. Heating repairs were the third highest category with 207.50 man-hours.

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the Common Council:

Attached you will find the monthly report for the month of September for the Engineering Department of the City of Danbury. Additionally, you will find information on the Public Works Department, the Forestry Department and the Parks Maintenance Department.

As I have done in the past, I have attached a list of assessment projects that you have referred to the Engineering Department along with a status of each of these projects. Additionally, with respect to assessment projects, you will find a tabulation of the allocation of funds appropriated for the design of assessment projects. I did report to you last month that it was our intent to get the mail surveys out in October for the Jeanette Heights and Cornell Hills neighborhoods for the proposed sanitary sewer and water projects. The surveys will be delayed about one month because of the complexities associated with calculating the preliminary assessment values for benefiting properties. It is our hope to get this mail survey on these two projects out to residents in November. We are looking forward to a public hearing on the Old Farm Road sanitary assessment project and very shortly we will be working on The Wilkes Road, which is a private road, road improvement assessment project.

Attached you will find the detailed status report that notes the many projects with which the Engineering Department, as well as other departments within the City are involved. You will also receive an emailed version of this report on the day of the Common Council meeting. This report contains most of the projects that we are involved in and lists the department that is responsible for the particular project. We also provide you with one or two lines of status information concerning the project. Again, I remind you that we do not list every project within the City, however, we do list the major ones. If you have any questions regarding the information on the project list, do not hesitate to bring them to my attention or to the attention of the department head listed as responsible for the project.

Within the Highway Department, as I reported to you last month, we began the preliminary work associated with Phase III of our annual paving program. We have begun raising catch basins and adjusting curb lines in anticipation of paving which is now scheduled to begin on November 8, 2004. Also, within the Highway Department, our sanders and plows are being placed on the plowing trucks and we have begun to mix our sand and salt within the complex on Newtown Road in anticipation of the winter season. Very shortly, we will begin adding to our stockpiles of sand and salt mixture around the City. As I reported to you last month, we are still waiting for delivery of six new trucks that were ordered through the bond package that was passed in March.

We continue to make improvements to sidewalks throughout the City and have now completed the sidewalk that runs along Hospital Avenue between Broadview Middle School and Germantown Road. That section of roadway adjacent to that sidewalk will be paved along with the Phase III paving identified above. We are waiting to receive bids on November 4, 2004 for the streetscape improvements along Center Street and a short portion of Town Hill Avenue which will certainly be an improvement for pedestrians as they travel from Main Street to the Town Hill Avenue area along Center Street. It is our hope that we can complete sidewalk improvements in and around the Danbury War Memorial building and we are looking at a major set of sidewalk improvements to Rogers Park, between Rogers Park Middle School and Coal Pit Hill Road.

With respect to the 21st Century Bond Package, we continue to make significant strides moving most of those projects forward. We are looking forward to bidding the two middle school improvement projects in the spring. We are also looking forward to getting our Magnet School out to bid this winter. We continue to work on the Roberts Avenue replacement school and would anticipate that going out to bid sometime next year and we will be working on the Danbury High School science lab renovations next summer while school is out.

We also continue to work on the design of the Rose Hill Avenue Bridge and anticipate that project going out to bid next summer. We will be going out to bid shortly on the Segar Street Bridge.

With respect to easements, the City attorneys continue to work on the many easements necessary for the construction projects that we are addressing. I have attached for your reference, a status report of the easements needed for the various construction projects. As you can see from the list, almost every project that you have authorized us to proceed with involves some type of easement. This is particularly true for sanitary sewer assessment projects and the process takes a considerable amount of time as we try to move projects forward because of the requirements that have to be met to acquire the necessary easements. We are still looking forward to bidding the Jackson Drive area sanitary sewer assessment project by the end of the year, as well as the East Ditch drainage project. We have started work on the Backus Avenue sanitary sewer assessment project and are nearing completion of the Candlelight Terrace water line assessment project.

With respect to older bond packages, we have awarded and signed construction contracts for the Fire Training Center upgrade on Plumtrees Road with General Construction Company. We expect that work to begin in the near future. We continue to work on improvements to Engine Company No. 25 on South King Street and are hopeful that we can go out to bid this winter. We need to acquire a number of waivers to zoning regulations, particularly as they relate to setbacks and the like. Our streetscape project on North Main Street is continuing and we are hopeful that that work will be completed in the near future.


With respect to the Forestry Division of the Public Works Department, I have attached for your review, a list of items that have been attended to during the last month. I also have attached for you a list of the dead trees and stumps that need to be removed, trees that need to be planted, and other related work. As I have asked you in the past, I would appreciate you looking at the list as it pertains to your wards or neighborhoods and let me know if you find anything missing. I am trying to develop a comprehensive list so that the Forestry Division can go into a neighborhood and take care of all tree related issues at one time. As you can see, the list is of significant size and we will be addressing this issue with Mayor Boughton next year as we move through the budgetary process.

With respect to the Parks Maintenance Division of the Public Works Department, we continue to provide maintenance on all the City parks and playgrounds. We are working with the Mayor's office to ensure that our parks are safe and convenient for the public to use. We are also moving forward with installing public bathrooms in Rogers Park as well as improving and increasing parking allocation in that park.

Lastly, as we have done in the past, we have attached an informational sheet that gives you the total number of sanitary sewer and water permits that were issued during the month, and an alphabetical listing of projects that are under review, design, and/or construction within the Engineering Department. As I have indicated to you in the past, these projects could be developer related projects and/or City related projects.

As always, should you have any questions regarding any information contained in this report or any other activity of your Public Works Department, do not hesitate to contact me.




