Re: Engineering Department Monthly Report to the Common Council

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the Common Council:

Attached you will find the monthly report for the month of October 2004 for the Engineering Department of the City of Danbury. Additionally, you will find information on the Public Works Department, the Forestry Division and the Parks Maintenance Division of the Public Works Department.

As I have done in the past, I have attached a list of assessment projects that you have referred to the Engineering Department along with a status of each of these projects. Additionally, with respect to assessment projects, you will find a tabulation of the allocation of funds that you have appropriated for the design of assessment projects. In last month's report, I did explain to you that we were having a delay in getting the mail surveys out on the Jeanette Heights and Cornell Hills neighborhoods because of the complexities of calculating the preliminary assessment values for the benefiting properties. As it appears now, we are looking to get these mail surveys out during the first or second week of December 2004. The Cornell Hills neighborhood is a very complex neighborhood and the engineering design presented us with quite a few problems relative to separating distances of the water and sewer lines and interconnecting the water system to the existing water company customers.

During the last month, however, we did have a public hearing on the Old Farm Road sewer assessment project, and we are looking forward to you giving us direction at the December Common Council meeting relative to this particular project. Once these matters mentioned above are addressed, we will be working on Wilkes Road, which is a private road, in an attempt to make improvements to that road consistent with the road improvement assessment methodology contained in the Code of Ordinances so that we wind up with a City accepted road.

Attached you will find a detailed status report noting many of the projects that we are involved in within the Engineering Department, as well as other departments within the City. You will also receive an emailed version of this report on the day of the Common Council

meeting. This report contains most of the projects that the City is involved in and lists the department that is responsible for the particular project. We also provide you with one or two lines of status information concerning the project. Again, I remind you that this list does not include every project within the City, however, it does contain the major ones. If you have any questions regarding information on the project list, do not hesitate to bring them to my attention or to the attention of the department head listed as responsible for the project.

Within the Highway Department, as I reported to you last month, work was completed on Phase III of the annual paving program. With the exception of minor driveway aprons along some of the roadways, and some curbing necessary to assist with the proper drainage of the newly paved roads, the paving program for this year is now complete. Duke Hart and I are working on a paving list for the upcoming paving season which will begin in March 2005. We will be coordinating that paving schedule with Mayor Boughton. This month we did receive delivery on four of our six new trucks, and it is our hope that the remaining two will be delivered shortly. All of the sanders and plows are now in working condition and we have a considerable stockpile of salt and sand mixture at our Public Works complex in anticipation of the winter season.

We continue to make improvements to sidewalks throughout the City, as funds were included in the 21st Century Bond Package. The sidewalk that runs along Hospital Avenue between Broadview Middle School and Germantown Road has now been completed as has the repaving of the roadway adjacent to that newly placed sidewalk. We are now working on sidewalks in and around the War Memorial and it is our intent in the spring to begin work on the Center Street sidewalks up to and including a portion of Town Hill Avenue. Once the Center Street work is completed early next year, we will continue with our sidewalk placement and improvement program at Rogers Park, installing sidewalks between Rogers Park Middle School and Coal Pit Hill Road. We will then place sidewalks on the west side of Kenosia Avenue, between Backus Avenue and Cendant Mobility, where sidewalks currently exist.

With respect to other projects included in the 21st Century Bond Package, we continue to make significant strides moving most of these projects forward. We will be going out to bid in the early spring on the two middle school renovations and improvements, and we are looking to get the Roberts Avenue replacement school out to bid sometime next summer. We will be making renovations to the Danbury High School Science Labs and the City is in the process of acquiring the Immanuel Lutheran School for the Head Start Program.

With respect to bridges contained in the 21st Century Bond Package, as reported to you last fall, work was completed on the West Wooster Street Bridge and the design of the Rose Hill Avenue Bridge is continuing in anticipation of the project going out to bid next summer. We will very shortly be going out to bid on the Segar Street Bridge. During the month four other bridges were inspected, finding one major and two minor problems. The major problem was found on the bridge north of the Padanaram Reservoir Dam, and the two minor problems are with the Crosby Street Bridge across Padanaram Brook and the bridge on Backus Avenue between Kenosia Avenue and the U.S. Postal Facility. We will be coming to you in the month of December with applications for State funding for these bridges and may have to make emergency repairs on the Padanaram Bridge in short order.

With respect to easements, the City's attorneys continue to work on many of the easements necessary for the construction projects that we are addressing. I have attached for your reference a status report of easements needed for the various projects. As you can see from the list, almost every project that you have authorized us to proceed with involves some type of

easement. We will continue to work with the attorneys to acquire these easements as quickly as possible so that we can get these projects out to bid.

With regards to older bond packages, as reported last month, the construction contract for the Fire Training Center Upgrade on Plumtrees Road has been signed and that work has now begun. We also continue to work on Engine Company No. 25 on South King Street and again, we are hopeful to get this out to bid this winter. The streetscape work continues on North Main Street, and, as I reported to you last month, this work is becoming more and more on schedule after getting off to a slow start. However, we are pleased with the quality of the work.


With respect to the Forestry Division of the Public Works Department, I have attached for your review a list of items that have been attended to during the last month. I have also included a list of dead trees and stumps that need to be removed, trees that need to be planted, and other related work. As I have asked you in the past, I would appreciate it if you would review the list as it pertains to your wards or neighborhoods and let me know, if there is anything missing. I am trying to develop a comprehensive list for the Forestry Division so that the department can work in a neighborhood and take care of all the tree related issues at one time.

With respect to the Parks Maintenance Division of the Public Works Department, that division is continuing to provide maintenance to all the parks and playgrounds. We will be working over the winter months to try to ensure that the parks are maintained in a safe and convenient manner for the public so that once the spring arrives, they will be ready for use. We are also moving forward with the improvements to Rogers Park, including the installation of public bathrooms that was contained in the 21st Century Bond Package.

Lastly, I have attached an informational sheet that provides you with the total number of sanitary sewer and water permits that were issued during the month and an alphabetical listing of projects that are now under review, design, and/or construction within the department. As I have indicated to you in the past, these projects are developer related projects for the most part, but do include some City related projects.

As always, should you have any questions regarding the information contained in this report or any activity of your Public Works Department, do not hesitate to bring them to my attention.


Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the Common Council:

Enclosed is the monthly report to the Common Council for activities that took place in October 2004. In addition, there are reports of vehicles that were maintained by the Public Utilities and Equipment Maintenance Departments.

During October 2004 we completed a lead and copper survey of our water system. The survey covered a sampling of 30 buildings selected due to locations, construction date, and inclusion in prior lead and copper surveys. The 2004 survey was the first since optimizing our corrosion control system at our water treatment plants. All of the locations were below the lead and copper levels allowable by State and Federal regulations. A summary of the results is enclosed.

As of November 24, 2004 there are 80 hydrants out of service, repairs to hydrants continued. I will be happy to review the information with you.


