

RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Danbury:

WHEREAS, the Savings Bank of Danbury Foundation has made an opportunity available for the City of Danbury Health, Housing and Welfare Department to apply for grant funding; and

WHEREAS, the amount requested of \$2,500 will be used to enable the school-based health centers at Rogers Park and Broadview Middle Schools to educate students about asthma through the American Lung Association Breath Express program; and

WHEREAS, there is no local match required.

Program Impact

If awarded, the \$2,500 grant from the Savings Bank of Danbury Foundation will enable the School-Based Health Centers located at Broadview Middle School and Rogers Park Middle School to bring the American Lung Association **Breath Express** program to the respective schools during the 2009-2010 school year.

Asthma, a chronic inflammatory disease of the airways, currently afflicts an estimated 15 million people in the United States, 5 million of whom are under the age of 18 years. Asthma is the most common chronic disorder of school-aged children and youth. It is also one of the leading causes of school absences among students in the nation: on average, children with asthma have more than three times the school absences than children without asthma.

Breath Express is the Connecticut American Lung Associations signature mobile lung health education program which travels to schools and communities throughout the State. Through an interactive integration of tobacco control, environmental health and asthma education, school students grades five through seven are educated of the dangers of smoking, the effects of secondhand smoke, the importance of clean air and how all of the factors impact with asthma.

The program will reach approximately 1,085 students grades six through eight at Broadview Middle School and 1,020 attending Rogers Park Middle School. Students will be scheduled to tour the mobile unit throughout the course of a six hour school day.

The educational messages presented to the students participating in the **Breath Express** program will be reinforced following the one day program by on-site school based health center medical staff through a variety of school wide health education outreach activities, distribution of patient education materials and through one to one patient education visits.

Fiscal Impact

This grant is available through the Savings Bank of Danbury Foundation. One-time funding totaling \$2,500 is being requested. No local match is required.

This grant provides funding for a two one-day asthma educational programs on the grounds of Broadview Middle School and Rogers Park Middle School and for the purchase of supporting miscellaneous asthma education pamphlets to be distributed to students through outreach activities and one-to-one patient visits.

If the requested funds are not awarded, the program will not be offered unless other funding sources are secured.

Anticipated Grant Lifetime

The proposed grant is a one time request to be utilized during the 2009-2010 school year.



Dear Sir/Madam:

This is in response to your request of December 23, 2003, regarding your organization's exemption from Federal income tax.
