Chief Baker,

I have been working with Sgt. Al Russo of your Department regarding our NCIC GREEN software. NCIC Green is a paperless messaging system for the unsolicited NCIC messages alerts that your department receives consistently each day. LawSoft currently services nearly 100 agencies in New Jersey and we are attempting to expand business into the surrounding states. We are located in northern NJ about 10 minutes from the New York State line. Your department became an attractive place for us to pilot this software in Connecticut for a few reasons. It appears that Danbury is a forward thinking city judging by the commitment the city has made with the investment into such an impressive Headquarters. My staff and I were also impressed with your Officers and their eagerness to embrace this idea. Danbury is also in close proximity to us being just an hour drive, which is a benefit to us to test a system in a new location.
