The following is a brief overview of activities engaged in by officers of the Community Services Division for the time period of March 15, 2005 to April 15, 2005.

Numerous events and meetings were organized, participated and planned by members of the Community Services Division during the month to include the following:

- ❑ **Citizens Police Academy Session#13** – Started March 15, 2005: Currently in the six week of this ten-week program.
- ❑ **Citizens Police Academy Session#14**- Currently recruiting and planning the next session of the Citizen Police Academy for the Summer/Fall of 2005. Anyone interested in attending should contact the community Affairs Office at 797 4644 – seats will be filled quickly.
- ❑ **Child Passenger Safety Fitting Station** – Weekly at CSD Building Monday mornings by appointment only. Currently our department has twelve federally certified Child Passenger Safety Seat Technicians, two of which are Federally Certified Instructor. **48** seat were checked/installed this month **YTD 174. (2004 YTD 666).**
- ❑ **Tribuna Crime Prevention/Education Articles**- Bi monthly crime prevention/education articles written by members of the Community Affairs office.

- ❑ **VALE Conference** – May 4&5, 2005 – Training announcement has been given to Capt Mulvey and posted for officers. VALE Grant funds will be used to back fill vacancies in the department to allow as many officers as possible to attend.
- ❑ **Danbury Hospital Safety Day-** March 19, 2005, Tours of police vehicles were conducted for children attending this event with over 250 free gun locks and 400 Computer Cop (internet safety software) were distributed to the participants of this event. In addition to this, safety information was provided to the participants concerning many crime prevention topics and children safety.
- ❑ **Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant FY2005-** Grant was written and submitted to USDOJ. Total award amount is \$28070.00.
- ❑ **Elderly Fraud/Scam presentation** – Being planned for May 3, 2005 at St Anthony's Church.
- ❑ **Children First 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Multi-Cultural Parents Day/Safety Fair** – Currently being planned for May 21, 2005, at Rogers Park Middle School.
- ❑ **CTDOT Seatbelt Enforcement WAVE #29** – Currently being planned for a two-week period surrounding Memorial Day.

**Community Policing Unit: Bicycle patrol: 7 officers {2 Ofc Vacant}:** Officers Timothy Strano, Marcel Kruijs, Paul Carroccio, Tom Collins, Steven Cameron, Michelle Brown, Lenny Labonia, {Vacant}, {Vacant}

With the one-year leave of absence granted to Officer Trevor Horten, and the reassignment of Officer Hayes leaves the Community Policing Unit two Officers short at this time.

Monthly activity: The community policing officers made **(9)** arrests this month, **(1)** for warrants and **(0)** drug related, **(0)** parking tickets were issued, and **(18)** State infractions were also issued, including **(1)** for drinking in public, **(2)** for loitering and **(1)** for simple trespass. In addition the above enforcement activity they handled **(217)** calls for service. Downtown Traffic Enforcement detail: **(11)** infractions, **(0)** parking, **(0)** verbal warnings.

Officers are currently addressing the issues at Kennedy Ave Park. Currently officer are coming in at 07:00 hrs and monitoring and managing this area for criminal and quality of life issues.

This unit is also proactively addressing the quality of life issues plaguing our dining and Entertaining District. They have been working with other unit within our department, city and with other state agencies.

Officer Assigned to the Community Policing Unit are currently engaged in a Downtown outreach program designed to bring the police and the downtown community closer together. Officer will be stopping into each business and making personal contact with each owner to address issue of concern and to obtain key holder information that should aid the whole department in responding to emergencies at anyone of these locations.

Sgt Karcz is also working with the US Post Master, and will be conducting traffic education program with their employees. In addition to this we will be providing their employees with a shortened version of our neighborhood watch program. They will be given a presentation that will cover such topics as recognizing criminal activity and reporting it. It will also cover how to be a good witness and crime prevention topics. This outreach will be collaboration between the Community Policing Unit and the Community affairs unit. If it is well received and accepted we are currently considering similar out reach programs with UPS and FEDEX.

**Graffiti Task-force: 1 officer:** Officer Kenneth Utter (203.796.1662)

The Graffiti Task-force is tasked with the identification of graffiti, graffiti writers as well as the clean up of graffiti on public property. Officer Utter continued his partnership with the court system, coordinating community service ordered work by GA#3. This has resulted in the removal of thousands of dollars worth of damage at no cost to city residents.

In addition to the above listed duties this position has been expanded to target illegal-dumping issues plagued by the city and it's residents and provides training to department officers in the areas of graffiti and gangs. He also provides this unique training to other area police departments.

The community Affairs Unit is tasked with the responsibility of all community outreach and safety programs conducted by the Danbury Police Department. In addition to this, the Community Affairs unit is responsible for crime prevention activities, injury prevention, Total Occupant Safety, Neighborhood mediation along with our new VALE program. Officer Bobel and our Information System will also fall under this unit's supervision, which includes the overseeing of our critical IMS/RMS/MDC systems.

Is directly supervised by the Commanding Officer of the Community Services Division and consists mainly of support services for the department. Under this unit are two fulltime units staffed by two sergeants and one civilian. In addition to this there are four part-time units staffed on an as needed basis, which consist of the Honor Guard, Chaplains, Recruiting Officer and Mobile Operations Center Team.

Sgt. Guerrero currently runs PAL operations with the assistance of Ret. Detective Lt. Thomas Mack. Currently the annual PAL carnival is taking place in North Street Shopping Center.

**Communications / Fleet Management:** Sergeant Joseph Brunelli, SPO Newkirk (203.797.4673)

Sgt. Brunelli is tasked with the daily duties of managing and supervising the department's school crossing guards and dispatchers. In addition to this he is responsible for overseeing our fleet of vehicles to keep them in operating condition.

- Sergeant Brunelli has submitted a letter requesting reassignment to the Patrol Division.
- Sgt Brunelli conducts weekly vehicle inspection in cooperation with the working 8-4 field supervisors.
- Sgt Brunelli just completed the FBI/Collect audit – a couple of issues have been identified and are currently being dealt with.
- Tow Company inspections due in April.

### **School Crossing Guards:**

Sgt Brunelli has requested a meeting with the Chief's office, BOE and the mayor's office to discuss the current problems with the school crossing guards program. This is being done in hopes of addressing these issues in a proactive manner so this program is operating efficiently and providing the appropriate coverage of our crossings.
