I hereby submit for your confirmation the promotion of Police Officer Martin Lobraico, Jr. to the rank of Sergeant within the Danbury Police Department. Officer Lobraico has successfully completed the Civil Service requirements for this position.


Officer Lobraico was appointed to the Police Department on May 14, 1990. He has received numerous letters of commendation and appreciation. He was recognized by both the Danbury Police Department, and the Fairfield County Chapter of MADD, for outstanding service and contribution in DUI enforcement. Officer Lobraico received an Exceptional Police Service Award in June 1991 for rescuing a victim from a vehicle overturned in a swamp. He has received the Safe Driving Award from 1991 to 1995. Officer Lobraico is a Certified Dispatcher as well. In June 1998, he received a Unit Citation for thwarting a burglary. Officer Lobraico also received a Medal of Meritorious Service for helping to identify and stop a kidnapping/robbery case in progress. He has received his B.A. Degree from Western Connecticut State University in 1993.

I hereby submit for your confirmation the promotion of Police Officer Lawrence A. Frinton to the rank of Sergeant within the Danbury Police Department. Officer Frinton has successfully completed the Civil Service requirements for this position.

Officer Frinton was appointed to the Police Department on September 22, 1983. He has received numerous letters of commendation and appreciation. Officer Frinton is a Certified Dispatcher and a member of the Police Dive Team. In the Fall of 2001, he was temporarily assigned to the Traffic Division issuing hundreds of infractions and parking tickets. Officer Frinton worked a special assignment in 1991 assisting the Detective Division due to the large number of thefts and larcenies from motor vehicles. He received an Exceptional Police Service Award for an incident in July 1996 for his supportive role in a successful rescue of a female attempting to commit suicide. Officer Frinton received a Unit Citation for a shooting incident in January 1999 in which the collective efforts of all involved resulted in the arrest of a suspect for such a violent crime.
