Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the Common Council:

Attached you will find the monthly report for the month of June 2005 for the Engineering Department of the City of Danbury. Additionally, you will find information regarding the Highway Division, the Forestry Division, the Public Utilities Division, and the Park Maintenance Division of the Public Works Department. Consistent with past practice, I have attached for you a list of major projects that the City is involved in, with a short report of the current status of each of these projects, as well as a notation as to the Department Head under whose jurisdiction the project falls. While the list does not contain every project that the City is involved in, it does contain the major projects. I will also email you an updated copy of the list prior to the monthly meeting of the Common Council. The update will contain the most current information. Should you have any questions regarding projects on this list, do not hesitate to contact me or the department head under whose jurisdiction the project is listed.

I have attached to this report a list of assessment projects that you have referred to the Engineering Department. On the list you will find the referral date, as well as a column indicating the location and the nature of the request (water, sewer, or other type of public improvements). Additionally, I have attached a summary of an account that you set up to deal with assessment projects and the disbursement of monies to the various projects on the assessment list. We continue to make significant project progress relative to this list and following is a short update. As I indicated to you last month, the Hawthorne Terrace Water Company project went out to bid, and the bids were received on July 7, 2005. We have reviewed the bids and made an award to the low bidder. The low bid is consistent with our engineering estimates for the project. We still have another phase of that project to put out to bid later this year. We are currently in the final stages of easement acquisitions on the Jackson Drive and the Carolyn Avenue neighborhoods sewer assessment projects and, as soon as those easements are acquired, we will put those projects out to bid. In the near future, we will be performing calculations on the final assessments on a number of projects that were completed late last year and earlier this year. I have also attached to this report a list of other items that may concern you

relative to the Engineering Department. That list contains the number of sanitary sewer and water permits issued during the month of June along with a numerical listing of different types of projects being worked on within our department.

With respect to the Highway Division of the Public Works Department, I am pleased to report to you that the paving season has begun. As you can see while driving around town, we have finished paving West Street and Lake Avenue and completed work on Crescent Drive and Park Avenue. We installed drainage on some of those streets and did intersection realignments at the intersection of Segar Street with Lake Avenue and Division Street with West Street. We are also in the final stages of filling in the swimming pool area at Rogers Park.

With respect to school projects, we continue to make significant progress on the Magnet School and the Broadview Middle School projects. The Rogers Park Middle School project is currently out to bid and by the time you read this report, we will have opened some of the bids for that project. We are also working on the design of four science classroom renovations at the Danbury High School and it is our anticipation to get the approval of the State Board of Education later this year, so that we can do that work next summer.

With respect to bridge work, we are currently in contact with on-call engineering firms requesting scopes of service for three bridges that you authorized us to seek funding for earlier this year, namely the Backus Avenue Bridge (adjacent to the U.S. Post Office), the Padanaram Road Bridge (just north of the Padanaram Reservoir), and the Crosby Street Bridge. The Rose Hill Avenue Bridge is still under design and it is hopeful that later this year we can submit to you requests for easement authorizations in order to complete the construction on that bridge. By the time you read this, construction will also have begun on the Segar Street Bridge repairs (near O&G Industries concrete plant). With respect to the fire stations and the Danbury Fire Department projects, we are hopeful that by the first of August we will have Engine Company No. 25 out to bid and we are also hopeful that during the month of August, we will near completion on the Fire Training Center on Plumtrees Road. We continue to work on the design development stage for Engine Company No. 26, having selected the site adjacent to the Danbury Airport on Kenosia Avenue for that engine company.

The Forestry Division of the Public Works Department continues to address various matters relative to trees. We have started an aggressive program of trimming back trees in anticipation of the winter plowing season. We are trying to target neighborhoods and trim trees back and, where necessary, cut off the lower branches so that the trees can continue to grow without interfering with the traveling public and our snowplowing winter crews. We are out to bid on the tree stump removal project that I have spoken about with you in previous reports and it is our hope that, within the next month, we will be able to begin removing stumps and repairing sidewalks in and around Danbury. Also, attached to this report is a report prepared by Mr. Mark Miller, the City's lead Tree Maintainer, that tells you some of the specific areas that the Tree Department has responded to during the month.

With respect to the Parks Maintenance Division of the Public Works Department, work continues on many school playgrounds throughout the City. We are trying to target school playgrounds while schools are out for summer vacation in a hope to not have any construction activities going on once schools reopen. We are working on the following school playground facilities: Mill Ridge Primary School, Mill Ridge Intermediate School, South Street School, Park Avenue School and the Shelter Rock School. We continue to make improvements to Rogers Park and we continue to develop improvement plans for the future. Our survey crews and our consultant's survey crews are gathering engineering information relative to the drainage system in


Rogers Park so that we can design a system that in as many areas as possible, eliminates the open trenches throughout the park. We have also been informed that last month we acquired the additional properties in Rogers Park so that our parks and playground areas in that jewel can be expanded.

We continue to work on sidewalks at various locations throughout the City and we are pleased that the contractor who was the low bidder on the Center Street streetscape project, which included sidewalk improvements, has signed the contract and should begin work shortly. It is also our intent to work with the parishioners of the Sacred Heart Church on Cottage Street to improve the sidewalks and drainage in that neighborhood.

Within the Public Utilities Division of the Public Works Department, we are beginning to attack the meter re-installation program. A number of meters have been delivered, and we are now coordinating with the contractor on switch outs of existing meters, which we expect to begin in the month of September.

I certainly would like to thank you for giving us the opportunity to serve you and the citizens of Danbury in the work we do, we feel that we are fortunate to serve and work in this community and in this manner.


