Attached please find the statistical analysis for repairs and maintenance work that the Public Buildings Mechanics engaged in during the month of July. In the month of September we received 210 new work requests and completed 139 work requests. In reviewing this report, you will find the repair time that was expended in major work categories, (current month versus previous month). Also listed is the total number of work order hours completed, (current month versus the previous month).

Our department was heavily engaged in plumbing repairs of the City's buildings and schools with a total of 388.00 man-hours dedicated to this service. The next largest area of concentration was in heating repairs, utilizing 98.50 man-hours of labor. Electrical repairs were the third highest category with 91.00 man-hours.

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the Common Council:

Attached you will find a monthly report for the month of September 2005 for the Engineering Department of the City of Danbury. Additionally, you will find information regarding the Highway Division, the Forestry Division, the Public Utilities Division, and the Parks Maintenance Division of the Public Works Department. Consistent with past practice, I have attached a list of projects that the City is involved in, with a short report of the current status of each of the projects, as well as a notation as to the department head under whose jurisdiction the project falls. While the list does not contain every project that the City is involved in, it does contain the major projects. I will also email you an updated copy of the list prior to the monthly meeting of the Common Council. Should you have any questions regarding projects on this list, please do not hesitate to contact me or the department head under whose jurisdiction the project is listed.

With regard to assessment projects, I have attached for your reference a list of projects that the Common Council has referred to the Engineering Department for consideration using the assessment methodology. That list is dated October 21, 2005, and contains the current status of projects. You will note that bids were received on the Jackson Drive sewer project on October 20, 2005, and we are currently reviewing those bids. I suspect that by the time you meet for the November meeting, we will have acted upon those bids, and begun the process of executing a contract with the successful low bidder. We are also in the final steps of a number of assessment projects and have included those for your consideration of a public hearing. Additionally, we have

forwarded to you the results of the East Pembroke Road/Wood Street sanitary sewer extension survey. This project is listed near the bottom of page one of the above referenced list. We await your consideration of that project.

I am pleased to report to you that work has begun on the Engine Company No. 25 addition and renovations, and work has been completed on the Fire Training Center. We continue to develop the design of Engine Company No. 26, and we suspect that over the winter, we will get this project out to bid.

We are also in the final stages of our paving for this year. We did incur a major delay, as a result of losing approximately 10 days to rainy weather. Since we award the paving through the bidding process, and the low bidder also had responsibilities elsewhere in the state, we have been set back with our paving for this year. It is our hope that we will be paving again at the beginning of November. Paving at that time will include Town Hill Avenue, Center Street, Middle River Road, and some other smaller streets.

Our school projects continue and we are making significant progress on the magnet school and Broadview Middle School. We expect that during the month of November or December, we will be out to bid on Rogers Park Middle School additions and renovations, and also in December or January be out to bid on the Roberts Avenue Replacement School.


I have attached for your review a hand-written report from the Forestry Division of the Public Works Department. The Forestry Division has been very busy recently, with all of the rain and wind storms, and we have augmented the Forestry staff with some of our Park Maintenance employees. Also within the Forestry Division, we have opened and awarded the bids for the stump removal project, and are awaiting contract signing so that work on removing stumps and repairing sidewalks can begin.

As a general note, the Public Works Department worked well through the recent rain storms, handling many small drainage problems and flooded low lying areas. We responded to a number of power outages, as a result of the wet weather, and our highway crews had to deal with the significant number of fallen leaves that blocked catch basins.

Within the Public Utilities Division of the Public Works Department, we continue to reinstall water meters throughout the city, and that project is moving along nicely. As I indicated to you in the past, the last time that we upgraded all of our meters was in 1981/82. Of course, the good news in the Public Utilities Division is that the reservoirs are now about 20% above normal. When I last reported to you, they were 10% below normal. We had an increase in our reservoirs of approximately 30%, which is reflective of about a billion gallons of water.

On behalf of the Public Works Department, I would like to thank you for giving us the opportunity to serve you and the citizens of Danbury through our work. Should you have any questions regarding this report or any matters related to your Public Works Department, please do not hesitate to bring them to my attention.
