

The following is a brief overview of the activities of members of the community Services Division for the time period of November 15, 2005 to January 15, 2006.

Members of the Community Policing Unit, better known as the Bicycle Patrol, participated in numerous citizen/community meetings including CityCenter and the Coalition for the Homeless. They continue to assist Officer Mortara with the installation and inspection of child passenger safety seats every Monday morning. In addition to these duties these officers have been concentrating their efforts in the area of quality of life issues brought to their attention by resident and business owners of the downtown area. Over the past couple of months officers have noticed an increase of graffiti in the downtown area and are currently working with Officer Mortara to combat this issue. Recently arrest warrants have been applied for and additional intelligence has been gathered that should result in the arrest of these taggers. Currently this unit is below staffing levels and comprises of only five officers. Their current supervisor is out indefinitely pending an application for a disability pension and the unit has four un-staffed positions.

Officer Mortara of the Community Affairs Unit along with Officer Carroccio of the Community Policing Unit are currently attempting to implement our Amber Alert ID program. They are currently waiting on the Rotary Club and Connecticut State Police to release the inscription codes so photos can be logged off our system. At

this point we are currently using the Rotary's Club's system on an as needed basis. The CPS team checked 620 seats in 2005, down from 666 in 2006. There are seats for the Citizen Police Academy still available and the spring session is expected to start mid March to early April. Anyone interested in this program should contact Officer Mortara at 797.4644.

The Danbury Police Department's Police Activities League (PAL) ran their annual car raffle, showing a loss of \$700.00. Sales of tickets were below average compared to years past. Sgt Guerrero, executive director, reports that the facility is in full use and he reports a gross profit from the holiday basketball tournament of \$14,000.00. Danbury Hospital will also be renting out the parking lot for employee parking which should bring some revenue.

Sgt Brunelli has been reassigned to the patrol division with his duties being divided up among different divisions. Sgt Al Russo now oversees the crossing guards, the records Division under Lt Charlie Kluge is doing alarm registry, Captain D Mulvey is coordinating towing services, Professional Standards Unit is doing NCIC/Collect auditing while Fleet responsibilities fall upon Lt Gantert.

Officer Bobel continues his work with Fire Fighter Sniffen and Wade Anderson of Data Processing on our Mobile Data Browser upgrade.
