RE: Monthly report for the month of June 2007

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the Common Council:

I am pleased to present to you the Public Works Department report for the month of June.

The Public Works Department is pleased to be moving forward on several construction projects. The building at Kaplanis Field has been started and is progressing at a rapid speed. The footings and foundation have been started at the sand and salt dome. Construction is expected to be completed in the middle of mid-August. The police station contract has been awarded to Konover Construction and the groundbreaking is scheduled for July 20th. We look forward to the construction of this beautiful addition to North Main St.

The Public Works Department is preparing to start drainage work and prepare several roads for new paving. Paving crews will be mobilizing the end of June with work to start the first week of July.

A new division has been created from the reorganization of the Public Works Department. Tom Hughes, as the Superintendent of Construction Services, will head the Construction Services Division. Dan Reisert was the successful candidate to fill the new position of Construction Manager and Fran Lollie has come over from the Highway Department to fill the new position of Assistant Construction Manager. I look forward to working with these individuals on the City's construction projects.

Engineering Report submitted by Farid L. Khouri, P.E., City Engineer:

Assessment Projects: The Nancy Drive/Carolyn Avenue area sanitary sewer assessment project is 90% complete. Paving will be done in August of this year. The Old Farm Road sanitary sewer

assessment project is finishing up; fencing and landscaping was completed. Final plans for the Wood Street/East Pembroke Road sanitary sewer are complete and the bids will be opened on July 24, 2007.

With respect to the Library Place Parking Garage, precast members are being erected rapidly and expected structure assembly will be completed in July.

The Public Works Salt and Sand Shed project was awarded to Dome Corporation of North America. Construction has commenced. The dome foundation and walls are almost complete. Expected completion date is September 2007. The site and electrical work are being performed by the City's Public Works crews.

Regarding the Kaplanis Memorial Field project, the project has been completed and they are currently working on the construction of the concession stand building. The scoreboard, bleachers and press box have been ordered and will be delivered within the next couple of months.

The Roberts Avenue Replacement School Phase II bids were opened and awarded to various contractors. Construction will start in July of 2007 and expected completion is January 2009.

Regarding the new Police Department Headquarters, the bids have been reviewed by the City and Konover Construction was selected as the successful low bidder. Groundbreaking is expected to take place in July 2007.

Traffic: In addition to the on-going reviews and approval process for land use development projects, the traffic engineer and his two technicians continue to work on the City's traffic signals to better enhance the vehicular movement on our major roads.

A field visit to the Long Ridge Bridge revealed that the bridge and its supporting elements are in poor condition. We are currently working on emergency replacement plans to this bridge.

Highway Department report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Highway:

The Highway Department is in high gear preparing for the start of the paving program. Valley Stream Dr., Adeline Dr., Purchase St. Berkshire Pl. and Willow Lane have been reclaimed. New drainage has been installed at Waterbury Lane, Willow Lane, Arch Street, Parker Street and Grace Street and repairs were completed at three locations. We have started the drainage work at the Public Works Complex for the footings and walls for the sand and salt dome. We continue to repair curbs and aprons that were damaged during the winter snow plowing procedures and patch potholes on a daily basis.

The Highway Department has also been focusing on the litter and debris on the City streets by sweeping every day. The spring yard debris program ended in June and was once again very successful. The collection was considerably higher this year because of the unusually heavy storms sustained in April and May. Eight new signs were installed and ten repairs were made at various locations throughout the City.

The Highway Department has been very busy and there is a lot of activity at the Public Works Complex as we strive to take advantage of the summer months to complete the outlined projects.

Parks Maintenance report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Highway:

The month of June is one of the busiest times of the year for the Parks Maintenance Division. The parks have opened for the season and we are pleased to see so many residents enjoying the many recreational opportunities that the City has to offer. The sprayscapes are a tremendous success based on the feedback we have received from the residents. I encourage everyone to take a ride past the Rogers Park site to see the number of children playing and having fun there. The baseball and softball season is off to a flying start. The athletic fields are maintained weekly to control litter and provide a safe environment for the players and spectators.

The mowing program is well underway and a crew of four has been clearing brush and weed whacking at all of the schools. The summer help program has started and has proven to be a great help to the Parks Maintenance Department in the past.

Forestry Department report submitted by Mark Miller, Foreman Forestry Department:

During the month of June we had tree calls at Apple Blossom Lane, Franklyn and Main Streets, Starr's Plain Road, Haddy Lane, Waterbury Lane, Wooster Street, Sherry Lane and Shelter Rock Road. Dead trees were removed at the following locations; large sugar maples at the City Hall parking lot and Middle River Rd., a Norway maple on Davis St., a large split sugar maple on Miry Brook Rd., a split cherry on Ta'Agan Point Lane, pine trees at the Rogers Park ball fields, four dead maples on Pleasant St. and Janet Rd. and two large dead oaks on Nabby Rd. We were assisted at some of the sites by CL&P and S&B Tree.

The Forestry Department accomplished a great deal during the month of June. Several projects in the downtown area were completed. The flowerbeds at the band shell on the Green and at the parking garage were mulched. We installed new banners on Main Street for City Center. A considerable amount of time was devoted to improvements at the Homeless Shelter. Many leaning trees that were growing over the parking lot were removed. We also partnered with Public Buildings to repair the streetlights at the sewer plant.

In the past few months, in addition to maintenance and repairs to our Public buildings, the staff completed the following projects: office renovations to the personnel office at City Hall; renovations of public lavatories and installation of new electrical and lighting, Highland Ave. Park; new electrical and lighting, entrance signage repair, Ives Concert Park.

In reviewing this report, you will find the repair time that was expended in major work categories, (current month versus previous month). 


