RE: Monthly Report for July 2007

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the Common Council:

I am pleased to present to you the Public Works Department report for the month of July.

July 20, 2007 was a historic day for the City of Danbury as we all celebrated the Groundbreaking for our new Police Station. Not only was this a historic day for Danbury, it was also a prime example of the City's commitment to our law enforcement personnel and the safety of our community. The Police Department has long needed more space, and this facility will be state of the art while providing room to alleviate the crowded conditions of the present buildings. The contractor's presence was immediately noticeable as they began remediation of the site.

On July 22, 2007 a 90th Birthday celebration for Charles A. Bardo was held at the Bardo Parking Garage, immediately followed by a construction tour. The project is on track for completion and the architectural features of the design are becoming apparent.

The new Sand and Salt Dome is nearing completion and we look forward to utilizing this facility during the upcoming winter season. This structure will allow us to perform a pilot program for the use of "Magic Salt" on two of our plowing routes. I will talk more about this pilot program in the coming months. The Public Works Department's team approach has been very successful on this project.

The newly created Construction Services Division hit the ground running. Within its first two weeks of operation, the division began to perform most of the required ADA Compliance work on the outside of the high school, and they are looking at rescoping some of our existing projects.

The Highway Division started the preparation of roads for paving, with our paving contractor immediately following our crews. The City has an extensive paving program which it hopes to have fully completed by the end of September.

The Buildings Maintenance Division has done a great job of not only staying current on their work orders, but also having a tremendous impact on several of our projects. This division has a very impressive and skilled staff who are effective in getting work done.

Construction Services report submitted by Tom Hughes, Superintendent of Construction Services:

Regarding local bridge repair work: the plans and specifications for the rebid of the Rose Hill Avenue Bridge project scheduled in August have been reviewed; review of the final plans for both bridges on Padanaram Road regarding constructability and relocation of utilities with the Engineering Department and the designer has been completed.

The exterior ADA Compliance project has begun at Danbury High School. New handicapped parking spaces have been installed, and we are currently further assessing the report prepared by Savin Engineers in order to plan the remaining outside work.

At Kaplanis Memorial Field, the bleachers and scoreboard have been ordered and will be ready for installation in early September. The exterior of the Field House building is done, the roof has been installed and work on the electrical and mechanical rough-in is currently underway. Completion of the project is expected at the end of September, with the dedication planned for October 13, 2007.

The new Sand and Salt Shed at the Public Works Complex is at 50% completion. The required drainage has been installed and we are currently grading outside the building in preparation for paving.

Engineering report submitted by Farid L. Khouri, P.E., City Engineer:

Assessment Projects: The Nancy Drive/Carolyn Avenue area sanitary sewer assessment project is 95% complete. Paving will start soon and is expected to be done by the end of August. The Old Farm Road sanitary sewer assessment project is finishing up; fencing and landscaping was

completed. The Wood Street/East Pembroke Road sanitary sewer assessment project is under construction.

The Library Place Parking Garage is expected to be complete by this November. All precast units have been erected, installation of the exterior brick façade has begun and they are now working on the joint connections and caulking.

A preconstruction meeting with various contractors on the Roberts Avenue Replacement School Phase II project was held to review the schedule and procedures. The groundbreaking was scheduled for August 2, 2007.

Regarding the new Police Department Headquarters, the groundbreaking ceremony took place on July 20, 2007 and site construction is underway.

Traffic: In addition to the on-going reviews and approval process for land use development projects, the traffic engineer and his two technicians continue to work on the City's traffic signals to better enhance the vehicular movement on our major roads.

Forestry report submitted by Mark Miller, Foreman of Forestry Department:

During the month of July we made tree calls on Starrs Plain Road, Bear Mountain Road, Hospital Avenue, West Pine Drive, Waterbury Lane, Main Street, George Street at Apple Blossom Lane, Park Avenue at Shelter Rock Road, and White Street at Bates Place. The following trees were posted for removal: two sugar maples on Deer Hill Avenue across from City Hall; trees at the new police station. Many dead trees were removed in July: two large sugar maples on Aunt Hack Road and Old Mill Plain Road; trees removed for a Highway Division drainage project on Sherry Lane; two trees on Apple Blossom Lane; five maples on Pleasant Street; two oaks on Nabby Road; one maple on Janet Road; and one large sugar maple on Fillmore Avenue. We were assisted at some of the sites by CL&P and S&B Tree.

In July the Forestry Division began trimming in preparation for the schools opening. We cut the walkway at Hayestown Avenue School and trimmed the trees on the playground, and are now working at Pembroke, King Street and Shelter Rock Schools. The Forestry Division also helped the Parks Maintenance Division remove seaweed at the town parks, maintained all the City flags downtown, and watered the flowers and all the new trees planted in the White Street and Lions Way islands and at the town parks. New burning bushes were also planted at the Rose Arbor Garden in Rogers Park.

Highway report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:

The Highway Division, in the month of July, has been concentrating on helping to complete the salt shed. The division has also been involved in grading, spreading stone, backfilling, and installing drainage where needed. New drainage was installed at Grace Street, Birch Road, Cel

Bret Drive, and Pine Mountain Road. All of these roads are on our 2007-2008 paving schedule. We also completed curbing repairs at four (4) locations and backfilled curbing on the roads that received new curbing. We paved Grandview Drive, Terry Drive, Waterbury Lane, Parker Street, Fern Street, Arch Street, and a section on Boyce Road. These roads all suffered damage from the April storm. New curb and driveway aprons were installed on Valley Stream Drive, Purchase Street, Adeline Drive, Terry Drive, Waterbury Lane, Grandview Drive, Willow Lane, Berkshire Place, Fern Street, Parker Street, and Arch Street. Thirteen (13) new signs were installed and repairs were done at eight (8) other locations. Our in-house paving crew are still repairing aprons and curbing due to the winter storm and ponding problems. We continue to patch potholes and are patching the roads that are on our Micro Paving list, which will start next month. The policing of our city hot spots for litter will be picking up steam in the near future. The sweepers and our downtown garbage trucks are out daily.

Parks Maintenance report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:

The Parks Maintenance Division, in the month of July, was in full swing maintaining the 400 plus acres they have to maintain during the summer months. The City Center concerts are in full swing, the farmers market is now open at its new locations on Kennedy Avenue. The Westerners, men's and women's softball, and the little leagues are running smoothly. A crew of four (4) men (two (2) regular park maintainers and two (2) summer helpers) have been doing maintenance at the city schools, cutting limbs and overgrowth on fence lines, spraying weeds, mowing, and weed whacking.

Public Buildings report submitted by Rick Palanzo, Superintendent of Public Buildings:

During the month of July, the Public Buildings mechanics were engaged in several projects in addition to their routine maintenance and repairs of Danbury Public Buildings and preparing the school buildings for the start of the new school year.

The staff built the office for the Superintendent of Construction, and spent many hours on the installation of electrical service and supervised the mechanical rough-in of Kaplanis Field House. The Public Buildings staff installed the water and electrical service for the new Salt and Sand Dome.

The video TV broadcasting system was installed and we are now able to broadcast to Comcast Cable customers live events at City Hall. The DDC building management software for City Hall was upgraded and now affords us better control for the City Hall environment. We are planning to install similar software at the Public Library, which will improve comfort for the workers and the patrons. Honeywell is midway through its upgrade of the EBI software, which is an upgrade for the existing DDC controls at the Danbury Schools.

Our online Request for Maintenance Services has been implemented. Now department heads and school facilities personnel are able to send their maintenance service requests directly to the

Public Buildings maintenance computer system. This eliminates the task of filling out multi part forms and mailing them to the PB office.

Attached please find the statistical analysis for repairs and maintenance work that the Public Buildings Mechanics engaged in during the month of July. In the month of July, we received 200 new work requests and completed 120 work requests. In reviewing this report, you will find the repair time that was expended in major work categories (current month versus previous month). Also listed is the total number of work order hours completed (current month versus the previous month).

Our department was heavily engaged in electrical repairs of the City's buildings and schools, with a total of 188.00 man-hours dedicated to this service. The next largest area of concentration was in mechanical repairs, utilizing 133.50 man-hours of labor. Plumbing repairs were the third highest category with 121.50 man-hours.


Public Utilities report submitted by Dave Day, Superintendent of Public Utilities:
