
Attached for your review is a resolution that will allow the City of Danbury, Department of Health and Housing, to apply for and accept funding from the State of Connecticut, Department of Public Health in the amount of \$694,416. The grant term will cover a three year period beginning July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2010, with \$231,472 being allocated for each year. A 25% local in-kind match will be met through use of facilities, coordinator salary and other services.

RESOLUTION

CITY OF DANBURY, STATE OF CONNECTICUT

RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Danbury:

WHEREAS, the State of Connecticut Department of Health Services has notified the Department of Health and Housing of the City of Danbury of the City's eligibility to apply for a School Based Health Center Grant in an amount not to exceed \$694,416; and

WHEREAS, the grant term will cover a three year period of July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2010, with \$231,472 allocated for each grant year;

WHEREAS, a 25% local in-kind match will be met through the use of facilities, salaries and other services;

WHEREAS, the State's purpose in providing these funds is to enable the City's Health and Housing Department to provide the age appropriate accessible and affordable medical and mental health care services to Danbury Public School students.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT Mark D. Boughton, Mayor of the City of Danbury is hereby authorized to apply to the State of Connecticut Department of Health Services for said grant funds and to accept the award if offered; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Mayor Mark D. Boughton is hereby authorized to take any and all actions necessary to effectuate the purposes hereof.

Program Impact

This grant will enable the City of Danbury to serve unmet health needs of the community's adolescent population through the provision of quality medical and mental health services. The primary beneficiaries of these services will be students enrolled in Danbury High School and Broadview Middle School.

Further benefits will be achieved through the removal of potential barriers to education, namely unmet health problems, which can interfere or hinder an adolescent's capacity to learn.

This impact will be achieved through the maintenance of an established State licensed outpatient clinic located on the grounds of Danbury High School and Broadview Middle School. Professional medical and mental health care services will be easily accessible to students, conducted in a confidential manner, and provided at no out of pocket cost to students or their family. Outreach to the student population, which will include health promotion and disease prevention strategies, will be carried out by program staff.

Fiscal Impact

This grant is available through the Connecticut State Department of Public Health. Three-year funding totaling \$694,416 will be made available to Level IV, fully operational, licensed school-based health center sites in Connecticut. \$231,472 will be awarded during year one of the contract, followed by an additional \$231,472 during years two and three. A twenty-five percent (25%) in-kind local match is required.

This grant provides funding for part-time staff positions including nurse practitioner, licensed social workers, and medical assistant. Relevant fringe benefit costs for salaried positions charged to this grant are also included in this budget. Additionally, this grant provides reimbursement for half-time salary and fringe benefits of a full-time City employee who acts as Coordinator for the center. A 2% Administration Fee and 2% Audit Fee are budgeted under this grant.

Anticipated Grant Lifetime

Currently, funding for services operated under this grant is available through June 30, 2007. The proposed contract covers a three-year funding cycle, commencing on July 1, 2007 and concluding June 30, 2010. As with all State contracts, funding is contingent on the passage of a State budget.
